# STATE OF NEW JERSE

#### INTRODUCED FEBRUARY 4, 1980

By Assemblymen HERMAN and STEWART

An Act concerning the possession of certain weapons under certain circumstances and amending N. J. S. 2C:39-6.

- BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 1
- 2 of New Jersey:
- 1 1. N. J. S. 2C:39-6 is amended to read as follows:
- 2C:39-6. Exemptions. a. Section 2C:39-5 does not apply to:
- (1) Members of the Armed Forces of the United States or of
- the National Guard while actually on duty, or while traveling
- between places of duty and carrying authorized weapons in the
- manner prescribed by the appropriate military authorities:
- 7 (2) Federal law enforcement officers, and any other Federal
- officers and employees required to carry firearms in the perform-.8

- (4) A sheriff, undersheriff, sheriff's officer, county prosecutor, 11

Any firearms transported pursuant to this section must be transported in the manner specified in paragraph g. of this section.
- g. All weapons being transported under subsections (b) (2), e. 142 or f. (1) or (3) of this section shall be carried unloaded and con-143 tained in a closed and fastened case, gunbox, securely tied package, 144 or locked in the trunk of the automobile in which it is being trans-145 ported, and the course of travel shall include only such deviations 146 as are reasonably necessary under the circumstances.

### STATEMENT

This bill would give special agents of the Division of Taxation the right to carry guns while on duty, a right they had under the old gun law. These agents enforce the laws against cigarette smuggling and encounter dangerous situations. The Attorney General's office has warranted that the training and experience of these agents justifies this right.

# STATE OF NEW JERSEY

#### ADOPTED JANUARY 29, 1981

Amend page 2, section 1, line 55, after "A", insert "special agent of the Division of Taxation who has passed an examination in an approved police training program testing his proficiency in the handling of any firearm which he may be required to carry or a"; after "policeman", omit "or a special agent of the Division of".

Amend page 2, section 1, line 56, omit "Taxation".

#### STATEMENT

This amendment would require special agents of the Division of Taxation who carry firearms to demonstrate their proficiency in the handling of any such firearms through an examination in an approved police training program.

'A-1847, sponsored by Assemblyman William Bate (D-Passaic) which requires the Griminal Disposition Commission to report its findings annually rather than every six months, as the original legislation establishing the Commission required.

The Criminal Disposition Commission is a statutory agency composed of representatives of all sectors of the criminal justice system and the Legislature.

Its purpose is to study and review all aspects of the system relating to the disposition of criminal offenders, including, but not limited to, terms of imprisonment, fines and other monetary punishments, parole, probation and supervisory treatment.

A-2068, sponsored by Assemblyman Martin Herman(D-Gloucester) which increases the maximum amount of local bonds which may be sold at a private sale from \$20,000 to \$100,000.

The \$20,000 figure was set in 1960, and this adjustment reflects increased costs due to inflation. In addition, the maximum larger offering results in a smaller overall percentage of the aggregate being used for advertising and legal costs of the sale.

A-2151, sponsored by Assemblyman Thomas Deverin (D-Union) which permits prosecuting agencies to donate forefited weapons of military value to the National Guard Military Museum of New Jersey at Sea Girt.

A-844, also sponsored by Assemblyman Herman, which permits Special Agents of the Division of Taxation to carry guns while on duty only.

The agents enforce the laws against cigarette smuggling and can encounter dangerous situations. The agents had the right to carry guns on duty before the enactment of the new Penal Code, but due to a technical oversight in the writing of the code, that right was eliminated when the Code became effective.

J Governor Byrne stressed when signing the bill that the agents were not permitted to carry guns off duty. They may carry guns while on duty only.
