STATEMENT

This bill increases the dog registration tag fee from \$0.50 to \$1.00 per year. This fee is remitted to the Department of Health special fund for use in rabies control. The fee was last increased from \$0.25 to \$0.50 in 1966. The bill, amending in section 2 of P. L. 1941, c. 151, makes reference to 3-year dog licenses. In the absence of this amendment, previous legislation (P. L. 1978, c. 168) permitting the issuance of such licenses could not be implemented. Consistent with this amendment, the bill also permits the collection of tag registration fees on a 3-year basis.

This committee substitute is necessitated by certain technical deficiencies in A-147 of 1980 and A-916 of 1980. Also A-147 and A-916 would have tripled the registration fee to \$1.50. The committee holds that doubling the fee to \$1.00 will satisfy projected Department of Health needs based on the following Rabies Control Program data:

STATEMENT

The purpose of this bill is to amend section 2 of P. L. 1941, c. 151 (C. 4:19-15.2) to include a reference to 3-year dog licenses which municipalities are permitted to issue pursuant to section 12 of the act as recently amended by P. L. 1978, c. 168.

This bill also provides for an increase in the registration tag fee which underwrites the cost of the State Rabies Control Fund in order to sustain an effective Rabies and Animal Control Program at the State level.

The sponsors statement adequately describes the provisions of the bill.

The Senate Natural Resources and Agriculture Committee released the bill without recommendation. While the objectives of the Rabies Control Program are worthy of continuation, the program should be supported by direct appropriation from the General Fund instead of charging a fee to dog owners.

The Assembly Committee Substitute for Assembly Bill Numbers 147 and 916 of 1980 increases the dog registration fee from \$0.50 to \$1.00 per year. This fee is remitted to the Department of Health special fund for use in rabies control.

The Department of Health points out that State funds are not affected since these moneys are a dedicated trust.

In compliance with written request received, there is hereby submitted a fiscal estimate for the above bill, pursuant to P. L. 1980, c. 67.
