An Act to amend the "Casino Control Act," approved June 2, 1977 (P. L. 1977, c. 110).

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State

- 54. Organization and Employees. a. The commission may estab-

The purpose of this bill, as drafted, is to remove the ceiling on the salary of the Executive Secretary of the Casino Control Commission. The position of Executive Secretary of the commission is the only top staff position specifically provided for by law. His salary is presently set at \$41,000.00. The removal of the ceiling on the Executive Secretary's salary will make it possible for the commission to bring his salary into line with those of the other division directors and also will make it possible to increase the salaries of employees under the Executive Secretary's supervision.

The Executive Secretary heads the Administrative Division. The other divisions are the Legal Division, the Licensing Division, and the Financial Evaluation and Control Division.

The Assembly State Government Committee reported the bill favorably, without amendment. An Assembly floor amendment reinstated a ceiling and raised it to \$55,000.00.
