Amend page 1, section 1, line 10, omit "the", insert "any"; after "in", insert "the county in".

STATEMENT

These amendments provide that applicants for membership on municipal district boards of registry and election need not be residents of the municipality on whose board they wish to serve, if they are residents of the county in which the municipality is located.
