AN ACT concerning the hawking, peddling and vending of goods,  
wares and merchandise and the soliciting of trade and amending  
R. S. 45:24-9.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*  
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. R. S. 45:24-9 is amended to read as follows:

2 45:24-9. The following persons shall have the right to hawk,  
3 peddle and vend any goods, wares or merchandise or solicit trade  
4 within this State, by procuring a license for that purpose to be  
5 issued in the manner and under the conditions hereinafter in this  
6 article prescribed, except, however, the aforesaid right to hawk,  
7 peddle and vend any goods, wares or merchandise or solicit trade  
8 shall not extend to or include any public beach or public boardwalk:

9 a. Every honorably discharged soldier, sailor, marine, nurse or  
10 army field clerk of the United States **[**, having been in the active  
11 military or naval service of the United States in any war in which  
12 this country has been engaged prior to the World War, or in the  
13 Boxer uprising, the Philippine insurrection or the Mexican expe-  
14 dition, or in any Indian wars or uprisings, or in the World War  
15 prior to November 11, 1918, that is to say the date of the armistice,  
16 or in World War II subsequent to December 8, 1941, the date of  
17 declaration of war upon Japan until September 2, 1945, or who  
18 served or shall have served in the Armed Forces of the United  
19 States, during the Korean Conflict from June 23, 1950 to January  
20 31, 1955, or in time of war-like conditions, and **]** who is a resident  
21 of this State.

22 b. Every exempt member of a volunteer fire department, volun-  
23 teer fire engine, hook and ladder, hose, supply company or salvage  
24 corps, of any municipality or fire district in this State, who holds

25 an exemption certificate issued to him as an exempt member of  
26 any such department, company or corps, and who is a resident of  
27 this State.

28 Hawking, peddling and vending hereafter may be regulated by  
29 municipal ordinance on public streets and highways.

30 **【The term “in time of war-like conditions” as used in this act**  
31 **shall mean and include any time after January 31, 1955, and prior**  
32 **to the date of the termination of the war-like conditions in the**  
33 **southeast Asia area by appropriate action of the President or Con-**  
34 **gress of the United States.】**

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

Governor Brendan Byrne today signed the following bills into law:

S-3025, sponsored by Senator Eugene Bedell (D-Monmouth), amends the Local Bond Law to permit a municipality's financial advisor to bid for its bonds at a public sale.

~~Under prior law~~, a town's financial advisor could not bid on bonds being offered by that municipality either at a public or private sale. This bill retains that prohibition for private sales, but permits the advisor to bid for the bonds at public sales.

S-3085, sponsored by Senator Frank Graves, Jr. (D-Passaic), permits the courts to postpone, suspend or revoke the driving privileges of a person who uses a motor vehicle in the course of committing a crime, a disorderly persons offense or a delinquent act.

This type of punishment would replace or be in addition to the dispositions currently available to the courts. Any suspension may not exceed two years.

S-3264, sponsored by Senator Steven Perskie (D-Atlantic), permits all honorably discharged veterans to receive special vendors' licenses.

Prior law restricted issuance to veterans who served in time of war or during war-like conditions. The county clerks issue the licenses.

S-1272, sponsored by Senator John Skevin (D-Bergen), permits a policeman to hold a titular office or leadership position in a fraternal, veterans or religious organization which has a club liquor license.

Under prior law, a policeman could not hold such a liquor license and therefore could not be head of a licensed club.

ACS for 1243, sponsored by Senator Matthew Feldman (D-Bergen), clarifies the responsibility for the conduct of municipal police forces by providing for a line of authority with respect to the police function in municipalities and by providing for the duties and responsibilities of police chiefs in those instances where that position is established by ordinance by the municipal governing body.
