AN ACT to reconstitute the list of organizations entitled to delegates to the annual State Agricultural Convention and amending R. S. 4:1-6.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
2 of New Jersey:

1 1. R. S. 4:1-6 is amended to read as follows:

2 4:1-6. Each county board of agriculture shall be entitled to be
3 represented in the annual convention by two delegates.

3A Each of the following organizations shall be entitled to be rep-
4 resented in the annual convention by one delegate: American

Governor Brendan Byrne has signed the following bills:

S-416, sponsored by Senator Wynona Lipman (D-Essex) creating an Office of Small Business.

Under the bill, the office will serve as an advocate for small business, monitor rule-making and legislation affecting those operations and provide technical assistance.

The measure also establishes a Small Business Advisory Council.

Governor Byrne conditionally vetoed S-416 on May 4, 1981, saying that although he supported the concept of such an office, its creation must be viewed in conjunction with the legislation creating the new Department of Commerce and Economic Development.

"I have stated that the next administration should undertake the task of organizing and staffing this new department to which the Office of Small Business would be allocated ... (and therefore recommend that) the creation of the new office ... be postponed until January, 1982," Byrne said in his veto message.

He also recommended that some technical amendments be adopted and, since the office will not be operational until the next fiscal year, suggested that the \$188,753 appropriation be deleted.

The legislature concurred with the Governor's recommendations.

S-1375, sponsored by Senator Raymond Zane (D-Gloucester), changing the list of organizations entitled to send a delegate to the annual State Agricultural Convention.

It deletes the Dairyman's Council and Fur Breeders Association, a defunct organization, and adds the Garden State Milk Council, the New Jersey Apple Institute and the Peach Promotion Council, all of which are active organizations.

#
