An Acr concerning education and supplementing chapter 46 of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
- 2 of New Jersey:
- 1 1. The Legislature finds that impaired hearing can greatly
- 2 handicap a child's ability to acquire language and develop speech.
- 3 This can have a profoundly negative effect, not only on the child's
- 4 intellectual development, but on his emotional and social develop-
- 5 ment as well. The Legislature further finds that in order to safe-
- 6 guard the well-being of those children in this State with significant
- 7 hearing loss it is of the utmost importance that they be provided
- 8 with adequate educational services. This bill attempts to insure
- 9 that the educational needs of all hearing impaired children are
- 10 met by establishing within the Department of Education the posi-
- 11 tion of coordinator of deaf education.
- 1 2. The Commissioner of the Department of Education *[with the
