The Senate State Government, Wagering, Tourism and Historic Preservation Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 87.

Under current law, net proceeds of games of chance, commonly known as bingo, lotto or raffles, are to be devoted to educational, charitable, patriotic, religious or public-spirited uses. This bill would permit bona fide veterans' organizations or associations, registered with the New Jersey Legalized Games of Chance Control Commission and licensed by a municipality, to use the net proceeds from games of chance for the support of the organization. Cost increases in electric, gas, oil and other utilities support the need for this provision.

This bill is contingent upon the passage of a constitutional amendment to allow veterans' organizations or associations to use net proceeds from games of chance for support of the organization.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 2012-2013 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review, which has been performed.

The Assembly Military and Veterans' Affairs Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 2519.

Under current law, net proceeds of games of chance, commonly known as bingo, lotto or raffles, are to be devoted to educational, charitable, patriotic, religious or public-spirited uses. This bill would permit bona fide veterans' organizations or associations, registered with the New Jersey Legalized Games of Chance Control Commission and licensed by a municipality, to use the net proceeds from games of chance for the support of the organization.

This bill is contingent upon the passage of a constitutional amendment to allow veterans' organizations or associations to use net proceeds from games of chance for support of the organization.

This bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 87 of the 2012-2013 session.
