The Senate Economic Growth Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 2504 with committee amendments.

As amended and reported, the bill would amend the State law pertaining to the professional licensure of veterinarians, in order to exempt from licensure, certain veterinary students engaged in supervised veterinary activities.

State law currently prohibits any person from engaging in the practice of veterinary medicine, surgery or dentistry unless the person has been licensed by the State Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners and has complied with all of the provisions of law pertaining to licensure. The bill would expressly exempt from this provision any student who is in good standing at an accredited veterinary school, and who, during a school vacation, preceptorship, or intern or extern program, performs veterinary duties or actions assigned by a qualified instructor at an accredited veterinary school, or under the direct supervision of a licensed veterinarian.

The committee amendments provide that the student: 1) may perform veterinary duties or actions that are assigned by a qualified instructor from the accredited veterinary school the student attends; 2) shall be under the direct supervision of a licensed veterinarian; 3) shall be associated with a licensed veterinarian; and 4) shall be limited to the practice of that licensed veterinarian. The committee amendments correct the section number of the bill concerning the effective date.
