These amendments would require that, after the adoption of an ordinance by the affirmative vote of a majority of all of the members of Gloucester City's Common Council requiring that three members of Common Council shall serve at large and three members of Common Council shall be elected from each of the city's three election wards, Common Council shall determine and designate, by ordinance, one member from each ward to thereafter be an at-large member. The amendments would also require that such a designation would be permanent.

The amendments would also require that Common Council adopt the provisions of this bill by ordinance in order to effectuate the changes to its charter contained in the bill.
