-- any other information the commissioner deems appropriate.

- Each school district and nonpublic school is to distribute the fact sheet annually to the parents or guardians of the students.
- Each youth sports team organization is to: request a copy of the educational fact sheet from the Department of Education for distribution to parents or guardians of children who participate on the youth sports team; and obtain signed acknowledgment of receipt of the fact sheet by the child and his parent or guardian.
- A "youth sports team organization" is defined to mean one or more sports teams organized pursuant to a nonprofit or similar charter or which are member teams in a league organized by or affiliated with a county or municipal recreation department.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 2012-2013 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review, which has been performed.

The committee amended the bill to: (1) add a section containing legislative findings and declarations; (2) remove the requirement that the Commissioner of Education develop the fact sheet in consultation with the Commissioner of Health; and (3) remove the requirement that a youth sports team organization request a copy of the fact sheet from the Department of Education for distribution to the parents of children who participate on the youth sports team. The committee also amended the bill to provide that the fact sheet must be developed by the commissioner within 120 days of the bill's effective date.

As amended and reported by the committee, this bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 2093 with Senate committee amendments, which also was reported by the committee on this same date.
