The Senate Community and Urban Affairs Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 2271.

This bill permits a State college to enter into a joint agreement with the governing bodies of any municipality or of the county within whose boundaries the college is wholly or partly located for the purchasing of work, materials, or supplies. The amendatory language of the bill mirrors language in section 10 (C.18A:64A-25.10) of the "County College Contracts Law," P.L.1982, c.189 (C.18A:64A-25.1 et seq.) that authorizes joint purchases between county colleges and local units of government.

The bill also amends the "Local Public Contracts Law," P.L.1971, c.198 (C.40A:11-1 et seq.) to permit local units of government to enter into joint purchasing agreements with State and county colleges.

These floor amendments:

- reinsert language which was deleted in the original bill authorizing the boards of trustees of two or more State colleges to enter into a joint purchasing agreement with other units of State or local government;
- clarify that a single State college may also enter into a joint purchasing agreement with other units of State or local government; and
- eliminate the requirement included in the original bill that a joint agreement entered into by a State college with a county may only be with a county within whose boundaries the State college is located.



The Assembly Higher Education Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 3460 with committee amendments.

Under the "State College Contracts Law," P.L.1986, c.43 (C.18A:64-52 et seq.), the boards of trustees of two or more State colleges may enter into joint purchasing agreements, and may also enter into such joint agreements with other units of State or local government. As amended, this bill clarifies that one State college may also enter into a joint purchasing agreement with other units of State or local government.

The bill also amends the "Local Public Contracts Law," P.L.1971, c.198 (C.40A:11-1 et seq.), to specifically permit local units of government to enter into joint purchasing agreements with State and county colleges.

The committee amended the bill to eliminate the requirement included in the original bill that a joint agreement entered into by a State college with a county may only be with a county within whose boundaries the State college is located. This language had unintentionally restricted the current authority of State colleges.
