AN ACT concerning special Omega Psi Phi Fraternity license plates 2 and supplementing chapter 3 of Title 39 of the Revised Statutes.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

I¹1. Upon proper application, the Chief Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission shall issue Omega Psi Phi Fraternity license plates for any motor vehicle owned or leased and registered in the State. In addition to the registration number and other markings or identification otherwise prescribed by law, the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity license plate shall display appropriate words and an emblem honoring Omega Psi Phi. The chief administrator, in consultation with the National President of Omega Psi Phi, shall choose the design, including an emblem and a color scheme. I¹

This bill authorizes the creation of a special Omega Psi Phi Fraternity license plate. The design of the license plate would be chosen by the chief administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission in consultation with the National President of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity. There is a \$50 initial fee in addition to the registration fees required by law, with a \$10 annual fee in addition to the renewal fees required by law.

Omega Psi Phi Fraternity was founded on the campus of Howard University in Washington, D.C. on November 17, 1911. With its rich 100 year history, Omega Psi Phi stands as one of the oldest Greek-letter organizations established by African-American men in America.

The Assembly Transportation, Public Works and Independent Authorities Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 3804.

As amended and reported, this bill authorizes a special Omega Psi Phi license plate. The design of the license plate is to be chosen by the Chief Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission (commission) in consultation with the National President of Omega Psi Phi.

In addition to all other fees otherwise required by law for the registration of a motor vehicle, there is an application of \$50 for these plates. The chief administrator is required to annually certify the average cost per license plate in producing, issuing, and publicizing the Omega Psi Phi license plates. If the average cost exceeds \$50 for two consecutive fiscal years, the chief administrator may discontinue the license plate program.

The bill provides that no State or other public funds may be used by the commission for the initial cost of producing, issuing, and publicizing the availability of Omega Psi Phi license plates or any computer programming changes which may be necessary to implement the Omega Psi Phi license plate program.

The bill also requires that Omega Psi Phi, or other individual or entity designated by Omega Psi Phi, contribute monies in an amount to be determined by the chief administrator, not to exceed a total of \$25,000, to be used to offset the initial costs incurred by the commission for producing, issuing, and publicizing the availability of Omega Psi Phi license plates, and any computer programming which may be necessary to implement the program.

The bill prohibits the commission from designing, producing, issuing, or publicizing the availability of Omega Psi Phi license plates, or making any necessary programming changes, until: (1) Omega Psi Phi, or its designee, has provided the commission with the money necessary to offset the initial costs incurred by the commission in establishing the Omega Psi Phi license plate program; and (2) Omega

Psi Phi, or its designee, has provided the commission with a minimum of 500 completed applications for Omega Psi Phi license plates.

The chief administrator is responsible for publicizing the availability of the license plates on the commission's website. Omega Psi Phi, or any individual or entity designated by Omega Psi Phi, may also publicize the availability of Omega Psi Phi license plates in any manner Omega Psi Phi deems appropriate.

The provisions of the bill remain inoperative until the appropriate applications and fees required to offset the initial costs incurred by the commission are provided by Omega Psi Phi, and the bill expires after 12 months if sufficient applications and fees are not received.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS:

The committee amended the bill to prohibit any State or other public funds from being used by the commission for the initial cost of producing, issuing, and publicizing the availability of Omega Psi Phi license plates, or any computer programming changes which may be necessary to implement the Omega Psi Phi license plate program.

The amendments also: (1) require an additional payment to be remitted by Omega Psi Phi to the commission of up to \$25,000 before the launch of the program; (2) require that 500 completed applications be collected by Omega Psi Phi and submitted to the commission before the launch of the program; (3) allow Omega Psi Phi to designate individuals or entities to assist Omega Psi Phi in raising funds, publicizing plates, and collecting applications; and (4) allows the bill's provisions to expire if the funds to offset commission costs are not received within 12 months.

- Omega Psi Phi is required to provide up to \$25,000 and 500 applicants before plates begin
 production to ensure that the Motor Vehicle Commission (MVC) experiences no costs in the
 design and initial production of plates. The MVC is also permitted to discontinue the
 program if the average cost of a plate exceeds the \$50 per plate application fee once the
 program has begun, guaranteeing that the State will experience no costs.
- The Chief Administrator of the MVC is permitted to set the initial fee at any amount up to \$25,000, so the initial fee should equal the initial cost resulting in no initial fiscal impact.
- While the MVC is able to terminate the program if costs exceed \$50 per plate, the MVC could realize profits in future years if the MVC experiences costs below \$50 per plate.

BILL DESCRIPTION

Assembly Bill No. 3804 (1R) of 2013 authorizes a special Omega Psi Phi license plate. The design of the license plate is to be chosen by the chief administrator of the MVC in consultation with the National President of Omega Psi Phi.

In addition to all other fees otherwise required by law for the registration of a motor vehicle, there is an application fee of \$50 for these plates. The chief administrator is required to annually



certify the average cost per license plate in producing, issuing, and publicizing the Omega Psi Phi license plates. If the average cost exceeds \$50 for two consecutive fiscal years, the chief administrator may discontinue the license plate program.

The bill provides that no State or other public funds may be used by the MVC for the initial cost of producing, issuing, and publicizing the availability of Omega Psi Phi license plates or any computer programming changes which may be necessary to implement the Omega Psi Phi license plate program.

The bill also requires that Omega Psi Phi, or other individual or entity designated by Omega Psi Phi, contribute monies in an amount to be determined by the chief administrator, not to exceed \$25,000, to be used to offset the initial costs incurred by the MVC for producing, issuing, and publicizing the availability of Omega Psi Phi license plates, and any computer programming which may be necessary to implement the program.

The bill prohibits the MVC from designing, producing, issuing, or publicizing the availability of Omega Psi Phi license plates, or making any necessary programming changes, until: (1) Omega Psi Phi, or its designee, has provided the MVC with the money necessary to offset the initial costs incurred by the MVC in establishing the Omega Psi Phi license plate program; and (2) Omega Psi Phi, or its designee, has provided the MVC with a minimum of 500 completed applications for Omega Psi Phi license plates.

The chief administrator is responsible for publicizing the availability of the license plates on the MVC's website. Omega Psi Phi, or any individual or entity designated by Omega Psi Phi, may also publicize the availability of Omega Psi Phi license plates in any manner Omega Psi Phi deems appropriate.

The provisions of the bill remain inoperative until the appropriate applications and fees required to offset the initial costs incurred by the MVC are provided by Omega Psi Phi, and the bill expires after 12 months if sufficient applications and fees are not received.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

EXECUTIVE BRANCH

None received.

OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES

The Office of Legislative Services finds that Assembly Bill No. 3804 (1R) of 2013 will have no net fiscal impact on the State of New Jersey. Before the MVC begins designing and producing the plates, Omega Psi Phi is required to provide up to \$25,000 in funds as determined by the chief administrator and to pre-register 500 applicants for the plates. This requirement ensures that the MVC will be able to recover its initial costs in producing the plates, and if enough funds are not provided, the MVC will not be required to produce the plates.

If these requirements are met and production of the plates begins, the MVC may still discontinue the program if the cost of plate production exceeds \$50 per plate, which is the initial fee that the MVC collects for each plate. This ensures that the MVC will not experience any net costs in the administration of this license plate program, and if the MVC is able to produce the plates at a cost below \$50 per plate, it is possible that the MVC could realize positive net revenues.

The overall impact of this legislation is likely cost-neutral to the MVC, realizing no net costs or revenues. The chief administrator is likely to set the initial fee at an amount equal to the expected initial costs resulting in no initial fiscal impact. In later years, the only way in which the MVC may realize net revenues is in the event that the MVC costs are less than \$50 per plate. If the costs exceed \$50 per plate the chief administrator may cancel the program. It is estimated that the initial production of 500 plates will consume much of the early demand for Omega Psi Phi plates, so any potential revenue to the MVC based on per plate sales would occur beyond year three of the program.

The Senate Transportation Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 3804(1R).

The committee amended the bill to establish a \$10 annual renewal fee for Omega Psi Phi license plates. The amendments also establish an "Omega Psi Phi License Plate Fund" and provide that the application and renewal fees, less the amounts necessary to reimburse the commission for administrative costs and computer programming changes, are to be deposited into the fund. Monies in the fund are to be appropriated annually to the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. and be used to support the organization's mission and programs, which include scholarships, social action programs, college endowment funding, and health initiatives.

As amended and reported by the committee, Assembly Bill No. 3804 (1R) is identical to Senate Bill No. 2864, which was also amended and reported by the committee on this date.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The Office of Legislative Services finds this bill will have no net fiscal impact on the State of New Jersey. The bill contains provisions preventing the use of State or public funds for the cost of producing, issuing, or publicizing the plates. Omega Psi Phi is required to provide \$25,000 to the commission, and at least 500 pre-orders for the plates to ensure that the commission has sufficient monies to fund the program, before the program becomes operative. If at any point during the program, the cost of plates exceeds the \$50 initial application fee for two consecutive fiscal years, the program may be discontinued by the Chief Administrator. Once the program is in effect, any funds received by the MVC beyond its costs, including the \$10 annual renewal fee, are to be deposited into a special fund created for Omega Psi Phi, preventing the MVC from realizing any profit from the program.

- Omega Psi Phi is required to provide up to \$25,000 and 500 applicants before license plates begin production to ensure that the Motor Vehicle Commission (MVC) experiences no costs in the design and initial production of license plates. The MVC is also permitted to discontinue the license plate program (program) if the average cost of a license plate exceeds the \$50 per plate application fee once the program has begun, guaranteeing that the State will experience no costs.
- The Chief Administrator of the MVC is permitted to set the initial program fee at any amount up to \$25,000, so the initial program fee should equal the initial program cost, resulting in no initial fiscal impact.
- There is a special Omega Psi Phi license plate fund established to receive any monies, including the \$10 annual renewal fee, in excess of MVC costs. This fund will ensure that any monies realized from the program, after payment of initial costs, will accrue to Omega Psi Phi rather than the MVC.



BILL DESCRIPTION

The bill also requires that Omega Psi Phi, or other individual or entity designated by Omega Psi Phi, contribute monies in an amount to be determined by the chief administrator, not to exceed \$25,000, to be used to offset the initial costs incurred by the MVC for producing, issuing, and publicizing the availability of Omega Psi Phi license plates, and any computer programming which may be necessary to implement the program.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

EXECUTIVE BRANCH

OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES

The Office of Legislative Services finds that Assembly Bill No. 3804 (2R) of 2013 will have no net fiscal impact on the State of New Jersey. Before the MVC begins designing and producing the plates, Omega Psi Phi is required to provide up to \$25,000 in funds as determined by the chief administrator and to pre-register 500 applicants for the plates. This requirement

ensures that the MVC will be able to recover its initial costs in producing the plates, and if enough funds are not provided, the program will remain inoperative.

If these requirements are met and production of the plates begins, the MVC may still discontinue the program if the cost of plate production exceeds \$50 per plate, which is the initial fee that the MVC collects for each plate. This ensures that the MVC will not experience any net costs in the administration of the program.

In the event that the program generates positive revenues, there is a special fund established for Omega Psi Phi to receive any revenues generated by the program, after the MVC has been reimbursed for its costs. The program receives a \$50 initial application fee for each plate as well as a \$10 annual renewal fee.

The overall impact of this legislation is likely to be cost-neutral to the MVC, realizing no net costs or revenues. The chief administrator is likely to set the initial fee at an amount equal to the expected initial costs resulting in no initial fiscal impact. In later years, the renewal fee may generate additional revenue for the program, which is to be deposited into a fund for the benefit of Omega Psi Phi. If the costs exceed \$50 per plate and the MVC is at risk of facing losses on the program, the chief administrator may cancel the program.

Upon proper application, the Chief Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission shall issue Omega Psi Phi license plates for any motor vehicle owned or leased and registered in the State. In addition to the registration number and other markings or identification otherwise prescribed by law, the license plate shall display appropriate words or a slogan and an emblem representative of Omega Psi Phi. The chief administrator shall select the design, including an emblem and color scheme, in consultation with the National President of Omega Psi Phi. Omega Psi Phi license plates shall be subject to the provisions of chapter 3 of Title 39 of the Revised Statutes, except as hereinafter otherwise specifically provided.

In order to be deemed complete, an application shall be accompanied by a fee of \$50, payable to the commission, which shall be in addition to the fees otherwise prescribed by law for the registration of a motor vehicle.
- c. The chief administrator shall annually certify to the State Treasurer the average cost per license plate incurred in the immediately preceding year by the commission in producing, issuing, renewing, and publicizing the availability of the Omega Psi Phi license plates. The annual certification of the average cost per license plate shall be approved by the Joint Budget Oversight Committee, or its successor.

In the event that the average cost per license plate as certified by the chief administrator and approved by the Joint Budget Oversight Committee, or its successor, is greater than the \$50 application fee established in subsection b. of this section in two consecutive fiscal years, the chief administrator may discontinue the issuance of Omega Psi Phi license plates.

- d. The chief administrator shall notify eligible motorists of the opportunity to obtain Omega Psi Phi license plates by publicizing the availability of the license plates on the website of the commission. Omega Psi Phi, and any other individual or entity designated by the National President of Omega Psi Phi, may publicize the availability of Omega Psi Phi license plates in any manner the organization deems appropriate.
- e. The chief administrator and the National President of Omega Psi Phi shall develop and enter into a memorandum of agreement setting forth the procedures to be followed in carrying out their

f. Omega Psi Phi shall appoint a representative who shall act as a liaison between the agency and the commission. The liaison shall represent Omega Psi Phi in any and all communications with the commission regarding the Omega Psi Phi license plates established by P.L. , c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill).

- 2. a. No State or other public funds shall be used by the commission for the initial cost of:
- 12 (1) producing, issuing, and publicizing the availability of 13 Omega Psi Phi license plates; or
 - (2) any computer programming changes which may be necessary to implement the Omega Psi Phi license plate program established by P.L. , c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill).
- b. Omega Psi Phi, or other individual or entity designated by Omega Psi Phi, shall contribute monies in an amount to be determined by the chief administrator, not to exceed a total of \$25,000, to be used to offset the initial costs incurred by the commission for producing, issuing, and publicizing the availability of Omega Psi Phi license plates, and any computer programming which may be necessary to implement the program.  - (1) Omega Psi Phi or the individual or entity designated by Omega Psi Phi, has provided the commission with the money necessary, as determined by the chief administrator pursuant to subsection b. of this section, to offset the initial costs incurred by the commission in establishing the Omega Psi Phi license plate program; and
 - (2) The liaison appointed by Omega Psi Phi pursuant to subsection f. of section 1 of P.L. , c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill) has provided the commission with not less than 500 completed applications for Omega Psi Phi license plates. These applications shall constitute the initial order for Omega Psi Phi license plates and shall be accompanied by a fee representing the total cost of the initial order. Such fee shall be determined by multiplying the number of sets of plates being

ordered by the applicable initial fee for each set of plates as set forth in subsection b. of section 1 of P.L. , c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill).

The bill prohibits the commission from designing, producing, issuing, or publicizing the availability of Omega Psi Phi license plates, or making any necessary programming changes, until: (1) Omega Psi Phi, or its designee, has provided the commission with the money necessary to offset the initial costs incurred by the commission in establishing the Omega Psi Phi license plate program; and (2) Omega Psi Phi, or its designee, has provided the commission with a minimum of 500 completed applications for Omega Psi Phi license plates.

The chief administrator is responsible for publicizing the availability of the license plates on the commission's website. Omega Psi Phi, or any individual or entity designated by Omega Psi Phi, may also publicize the availability of Omega Psi Phi license plates in any manner Omega Psi Phi deems appropriate.

The provisions of the bill remain inoperative until the appropriate applications and fees required to offset the initial costs incurred by the commission are provided by Omega Psi Phi, and the bill expires after 12 months if sufficient applications and fees are not received.

The committee amended the bill to establish a \$10 annual renewal fee for Omega Psi Phi license plates. The amendments also establish an "Omega Psi Phi License Plate Fund" and provide that the application and renewal fees, less the amounts necessary to reimburse the commission for administrative costs and computer programming changes, are to be deposited into the fund. Monies in the fund are to be appropriated annually to the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. and be used to support the organization's mission and programs, which include scholarships, social action programs, college endowment funding, and health initiatives.

As amended and reported by the committee, Senate Bill No. 2864 is identical to Assembly Bill No. 3804 (1R), which was also amended and reported by the committee on this date.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

EXECUTIVE BRANCH

OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES

The Office of Legislative Services finds that Senate Bill No. 2864 (1R) of 2013 will have no net fiscal impact on the State of New Jersey. Before the MVC begins designing and producing the plates, Omega Psi Phi is required to provide up to \$25,000 in funds as determined by the chief administrator and to pre-register 500 applicants for the plates. This requirement ensures

that the MVC will be able to recover its initial costs in producing the plates, and if enough funds are not provided, the program will remain inoperative.

If these requirements are met and production of the plates begins, the MVC may still discontinue the program if the cost of plate production exceeds \$50 per plate, which is the initial fee that the MVC collects for each plate. This ensures that the MVC will not experience any net costs in the administration of the program.

In the event that the program generates positive revenues, there is a special fund established for Omega Psi Phi to receive any revenues generated by the program, after the MVC has been reimbursed for its costs. The program receives a \$50 initial application fee for each plate as well as a \$10 annual renewal fee.

The overall impact of this legislation is likely to be cost-neutral to the MVC, realizing no net costs or revenues. The chief administrator is likely to set the initial fee at an amount equal to the expected initial costs resulting in no initial fiscal impact. In later years, the renewal fee may generate additional revenue for the program, which is to be deposited into a fund for the benefit of Omega Psi Phi. If the costs exceed \$50 per plate and the MVC is at risk of facing losses on the program, the chief administrator may cancel the program.
