AN ACT concerning purchases through the Division of Purchase and Property in the Department of the Treasury and amending P. L. 1959, c. 40.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. Section 1 of P. L. 1959, c. 40 (C. 52:27B-56.1) is amended to
2 read as follows:

3 1. The Director of the Division of Purchase and Property may,
4 by joint action, purchase any articles used or needed by the State
5 and the Palisades Interstate Park Commission, the New Jersey
6 Highway Authority, the New Jersey Turnpike Authority, the
7 Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission, the Port **[of New**
8 **York]** Authority *of New York and New Jersey*, the South Jersey
9 Port **[Commission]** Corporation, the Passaic Valley Sewerage
10 Commission, the Delaware River Port Authority, **[or]** Rutgers,
11 The State University, *the New Jersey Sports and Exposition*
12 *Authority, the New Jersey Housing Finance Agency, the New*
13 *Jersey Mortgage Finance Authority, the New Jersey Health Care*
14 *Facilities Financing Authority, the New Jersey Education Facili-*
15 *ties Authority, the New Jersey Economic Development Authority,*
16 *the New Jersey Expressway Authority or any other agency, com-*
17 *mission, board, authority or other such governmental entity which*
18 *is established and is allocated to a State department or any bi-state*
19 *governmental entity of which the State of New Jersey is a member.*

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

EXPLANATION—Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets **[thus]** in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

STATEMENT

Governor Brendan Byrne today signed S-1349, sponsored by Senator Anthony Scardino, Jr. (D-Bergen) which enables all state agencies to participate in the joint purchase programs conducted by the Division of Purchase and Property in the Department of Treasury.

The bill amends a 1959 law, which allowed only the Palisades Interstate Park Commission, the New Jersey Highway Authority, the New Jersey Turnpike Authority, the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Authority, the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey, the South Jersey Port Commission, the Passaic Valley Sewerage Commission, the Delaware River Port Authority and Rutgers, the State University, to participate in such programs.

When the Division of Purchase and Property purchases supplies in the larger quantities produced by combining agency needs, the individual agencies are able to save money.
