Governor Brendan Byrne today signed <u>S-1349</u>, sponsored by Senator Anthony Scardino, Jr. (D-Bergen) which enables all state agencies to participate in the joint purchase programs conducted by the Division of Purchase and Property in the Department of Treasury.

The bill amends a 1959 law, which allowed only the Palisades
Interstate Park Commission, the New Jersey Highway Authority, the
New Jersey Turnpike Authority, the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge
Authority, the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey, the South
Jersey Port Commission, the Passaic Valley Sewerage Commission, the
Delaware River Port Authority and Rutgers, the State University, to
participate in such programs.

When the Division of Purchase and Property purchases supplies in the larger quantities produced by combining agency needs, the individual agencies are able to save money.

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
