An Act concerning the awarding of public contracts by the Passaic Valley Sewerage Commission, and amending R. S. 58:14-22.

- BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 1

- 2 58:14-22. Whenever any work to be performed or any material
- to be furnished shall involve an expenditure of money exceeding 3
- the sum of [\$2,000.00] \$4,500.00, the commissioners shall designate

- receive proposals in writing for doing the work and furnishing the 6

DATED: JUNE 26, 1980

This bill conforms the law concerning the awarding of contracts by the Passaic Valley Sewerage Commission to the local Public Contracts Law. That law was recently amended by P. L. 1979, c. 350 to allow contracts under \$4,500.00 to be awarded without public bidding.

As originally drafted the bill permitted the commissioners to designate another person to receive and open bids publicly thus making it unnecessary for the commissioners to meet for bid openings.

The committee amended the bill to require the commission to designate the chief administrative officer of the commission to perform this function. The awarding of contracts will remain the sole responsibility of the commissioners.
