# STATE OF NEW JERSEY

#### INTRODUCED JUNE 12, 1980

### By Assemblyman DOYLE

Referred to Committee on Revenue, Finance and Appropriations

An Act to amend the title of "An act concerning electric and gas utilities, supplementing Title 48 of the Revised Statutes, making an appropriation and repealing P. L. 1977, c. 440," approved September 18, 1979 (P. L. 1979, c. 197, C. 48:2–29.15 et seq.), so that the same shall read "An act concerning electric and gas utility bill credits, supplementing Title 48 of the Revised Statutes, providing for the transfer of the administration of the 'Lifeline Credit Program' to the Department of Human Services, making an appropriation and repealing P. L. 1977, c. 440," and amending and supplementing the body of said act.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
- 2 of New Jersey:
- 1. The title of P. L. 1979, c. 197 (C. 48:2-29.15 et seq.) is amended
- 2 to read as follows: An act concerning electric and gas [utilities]
- 3 utility bill credits, supplementing Title 48 of the Revised Statutes,
- 4 providing for the transfer of the administration of the "Lifeline
- 5 Credit Program" to the Department of Human Services, making
- 6 an appropriation and repealing P. L. 1977, c. 440.
- 2. Section 1 of P. L. 1979, c. 197 (C. 48:2-29.15) is amended to
- 2 read as follows:

### STATEMENT

This bill increases from \$100.00 to \$125.00 the gas and electric utility bill credits provided to eligible senior citizens and disabled persons under the "Lifeline Credit Program." This bill also transfers administrative jurisdiction over the program from the Board of Public Utilities to the Department of Human Services, which has actually had the principal responsibility for implementing the program, and makes purely technical changes in the eligibility criteria for the program.

The Lifeline Credit program was enacted last year as a one year experimal a December 31, 1979 cut-off date for eligibility. It has provided approximal 200,000 households with a \$100 utility credit. This bill makes the program a one by providing for the application or certification of eligible participant. July 1, and December 31 of each year.

This bill also shifts the administration of the Lifeline Credit Progra Board of Public Utilities to the Department of Human Services.

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
