The Senate Education Committee favorably reports this bill and endorses the Assembly Education Committee statement which reads as follows:

Purpose:

Assembly Bill No. 362, with Assembly committee amendments, proposes to allow newly elected members of Type II school boards to take office during the week following the school election.

BACKGROUND:

In 1978 the school election and budget process was extended by the Legislature for the purpose of providing districts with more time for budget preparation. It was the opinion of the members of the Education Committee that a waiting period was necessary after the election to provide time for the incumbent board to clear up any budget issues as well as settle any personnel issues.

It is the feeling of the Assembly Education Committee that the waiting period that currently exists is unnecessary and that newly elected board members are adequately briefed to prevent any problems in the transition. NOVEMBER 12, 1980

New Council and the second

Governor Byrne today filed the following bills:

<u>S-1473</u>, sponsored by Senator William Hamilton (D-Middlesex) which requires the advice and consent of the Senate on the designation of a member of the Casino Control Commission who is to serve as Chairman upon the expiration of the present Chairman's term.

Governor Byrne conditionally vetoed the bill on October 20, saying that the confirmation process for this nomination should not be "unduely extended" and suggesting that a new section be inserted to require Senate confirmation of the nomination within 45 days of the Governor's designation of the Chairman.

Under the Governor's suggestions, if the Senate fails to confirm the designee within 45 days, then he or she shall be deemed consented by the Senate.

The Legislature concurred with the Governor's recommendations.

<u>S-1568</u>, sponsored by Senator Joseph P. Maressa (D-Gloucester) which validates a school district bond issue in Deptford Township despite the fact that a notice of sale was not published, as required by law, in a county newspaper having substantial circulation within the county, provided that the notice was published at least 7 days prior to the sale in a publication carrying financial news published in New York City or New Jersey and that no suit has commenced contesting the bond issue.

<u>A-362</u>, sponsored by Assemblyman John Girgenti (D-Passaic) which eliminates the current six-week waiting period that must elapse between school board elections in Type II districts and the date on which the board members take office.

Under this bill, newly elected members will take office the week following their election.

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
