AN ACT providing for an endowed chair at an institution of higher education and supplementing Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. There is created at the Seton Hall University School of Law
2 a distinguished chair which shall be known as The Richard J.
3 Hughes Chair for Constitutional and Public Law and Service.

1 2. Subject to available appropriations, Seton Hall shall select
2 an outstanding scholar to fill the chair on such terms and conditions
3 as may be agreed upon, subject to the approval of the Chancellor
4 of Higher Education. The person appointed to the Hughes Chair
5 maybe granted tenure on appointment.

1 3. Seton Hall University may utilize funds appropriated for the
2 purposes of this act for the provision of equipment, supplies, clerical and research assistants and such other appropriate support as
3 is necessary for the research conducted by the holder of the Hughes
4 Chair, and for development and scholarly use of the Hughes
5 Archives.

1 4. The provisions of N. J. S. 18A:62-2 shall not be applicable
2 to this act.

1 5. This act shall take effect immediately.

Governor Brendan Byrne today signed S-1218, sponsored by Senator Frank J. Dodd (D-Essex), which establishes a Richard J. Hughes Chair for Constitutional and Public Law and Services at Seton Hall University Law School.

The bill was signed in a public ceremony at the University Law School, on 1111 Raymond Boulevard in Newark.

According to the bill, Seton Hall shall appoint, subject to the approval of the Chancellor of Higher Education, an outstanding scholar, who may be granted tenure on appointment.

The selection of a Hughes Scholar is "subject to available appropriations." For fiscal year 1980-81, \$65,000 has been appropriated for the chair. Seton Hall may use the funds for equipment, supplies, clerical and research assistants and other support of the chair-holder's unspecified research; and for development and scholarly use of the Hughes archives, located at Seton Hall.
