- 1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State

- 1 1. R. S. 19:45-7 is amended to read as follows:

17 The members of the county board in counties other than counties 18 of the first class and in counties of the first class not having a 19 superintendent of elections who shall be elected as chairman and 20 secretary thereof and who shall perform the duties of chairman 21 and secretary thereof shall each receive an additional compensation 22 of one-half of the compensation of the individual members of the 23 board.

ASSEMBLY COUNTY GOVERNMENT COMMITTEE STATEMENT TO SENATE, No. 1250

STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: SEPTEMBER 15, 1980

Senate Bill No. 1250 would increase the minimum and maximum amount which counties may pay members of county election boards in compensation for services. The bill, in effect, provides that the current maximum salary in each population category would become the minimum, with a new maximum established for each. The new salaries would take effect only upon the approval of the governing body of the county.

As received by the committee, the bill further provided that the commissioner of registration in a county having a superintendent of elections would receive the same salary as do secretaries of county boards of elections who also perform the duties of commissioner of registration.

The committee amended the bill to provide that the salary of a commissioner of registration in a county having a superintendent of elections shall be subject to the approval of the governing body of the county. The committee also amended the bill to give the governing body of counties of the first class which have a superintendent of elections an option in determining the salary of the county commissioner of registration. As amended, the bill provides that the governing body may either pay such a commissioner of registration not less than \$10,000.00 nor more than \$12,500.00 as compensation for his services as commissioner of registration; or, may pay such commissioner a salary not less than the maximum which a secretary of a county board of elections in a county of the same class, which does not have a superintendent of elections, receives for performing the duties of secretary and commissioner of registration. The bill provides that such a secretary receive: (1) for performing the duties of secretaryan amount equal to one-half the compensation of the individual board members, and, (2) for performing the duties of commissioner of registration-an amount equal to one-half his salary as member and secretary of a county board.

In addition, the committee amended the bill to eliminate the possibility that this bill would unintentionally have an adverse impact on any incumbent superintendent of elections.

Senate Bill No. 1250 would increase minimum amount and the maximum amount which counties may pay members of county election boards in compensation for services. The bill in effect provides that the current maximum salary in each population category would become the minimum, with a new maximum established for each. The new salaries would take effect only upon approval of the county governing body.

The bill also provides that the commissioner of registration in a county having a superintendent of elections shall receive the same salary as do secretaries of county boards of elections who also perform the duties of commissioner of registration.

The committee amendments are purely technical in nature and are designed to conform the language of the statute with the provisions of the "Optional County Charter Law" (P. L. 1972, c. 154; C. 40:41A-1 et seq.).

Governor Brendan Byrne has signed the following bills:

<u>S-1225</u>, sponsored by Senator William J. Hamilton, Jr. (D-Middlesex), which will require the Attorney General to include in his annual report to the Governor and the Legislature statistical information pertaining to grants of immunity.

The information required includes:

--The number of persons to whom immunity was granted or approved;

--The number of indictments dismissed as a result of the granting or approval of immunity and the nature of the charges included therein;

--The number of convictions obtained in cases in which a person or persons had immunity granted to them or approval;

--The number of persons adjudged in contempt for refusal to testify as a result of a grant or approval of immunity;

--The number of persons committed to jail as a result of an adjudication of contempt in subsection above;

--The number of persons who have purged themselves after being committed to jail;

--Such other information as the Attorney General deems appropriate.

<u>S-1250</u>, sponsored by Senttor Carmen A. Orechio (D-Essex), which will permit certain salary increases to all county election board members and to the commissioners of registration in Hudson, Essex, and Bergen Counties at the discretion of the respective county governing bodies.

All increased costs of this bill will be borne by the counties but the increases are not mandatory. The last increase for board members was in 1975.

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
