An Act to amend "An act making uniform regulations on net fishing in certain waters within the jurisdiction of this State, and providing for the licensing of same, and repealing sections 23:9-59 to 23:9-93, inclusive, 23:9-99, 23:9-101 to 23:9-107, inclusive, and 23:9-113 of the Revised Statutes," approved June 14, 1941 (P. L. 1941, c. 211), as said title was amended by P. L. 1942, c. 294.

- 1. Section 1 of P. L. 1941, c. 211 (C. 23:5-24.1) is amended to

- 3 1. No person shall fish with, set, fix, fasten, draw, or drift any
- 4 net of any description whatsoever, from or in the inland tidal
- 5 waters, bays, coves, rivers, or creeks, or in the Atlantic ocean
- 6 within 3 nautical miles of the coast line, unless he shall first have

Governor Brendan Byrne today signed the following bills into law.

A-673, sponsored by Assemblyman Vincent O. Pellechia (D-Passaic), which permits the governing body of a county, through either resolution or ordinance, to change the name of the county Welfare Board to the County Board of Social Services.

A-769, sponsored by Assemblyman James W. Hurley, (R-Cape May/Cumberland) which requires that no person could engage in net fishing in New Jersey's tidal waters until he had procured a fishing license, had received it and had it in his possession while fishing.

The original statute required only that a person procure a license, which could be interpreted to mean that a person merely have had to apply for a license but that he did not have to receive it or have it in his possession while fishing.

A-1700, sponsored by Assemblyman Daniel Newman (D-Ocean), which changes the reporting date of the Commission to Study Teacher Preparation Programs from January 1, 1979 to September 1, 1979.
