An Act concerning motor vehicle driver special learners' permits and amending P. L. 1977, c. 25, s. 6 (C. 39:3-13. 2a).

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State

- 1. Section 6 of P. L. 1977, c. 25 (C. 39:3-13. 2a) is amended.
- 2 6. Any person to whom a special learner's permit has been issued
- 3 pursuant to section 1 of P. L. 1950, c. 127 (C. 39:3-13.1), upon
- 4 attaining 16 years and 6 months of age, or upon successful com-
- 5 pletion prior thereto of a behind-the-wheel driving course con-
- 6 ducted by a licensed drivers' school or of a public, parochial or
- 7 private school driving education course, shall be entitled to retain
- 8 the special learner's permit in his own possession. Such person
