Assembly Bill No. 604 would authorize counties and municipalities to establish the position of local historian. The local historian would serve without compensation, but the local governing body may by annual appropriation reimburse the local historian for expenses incurred.

The bill sets forth the duties and responsibilities of the position, including the preservation of historical materials, the preparation and publication of a local history and of other historical materials, the provision of advice concerning historical landmarks, and assisting in commemorative projects. The local historian would be required to report annually to the chief executive officer and governing body of the local unit, and to the New Jersey Historical Commission.

The bill contains provisions designed to address jurisdictional questions which might arise between a county local historican and local historians of municipalities within the county. The county local historian would act as historical adviser to municipalities within the county which have no local historian, but may advise a municipal local historian only upon request.

In counties having a cultural and heritage commission, the county could vest the duties and responsibilities of county local historian in the chairperson of such commission.

The bill would permit a local historian to employ necessary clerical assistants within the limits of funds made available in the annual local budget for such purposes.

The Senate committee amendments, although extensive, are, for the most part, designed to rectify various language difficulties and other errors in the bill, and are not designed to alter the intent of the bill.

The committee amendments would assure uniform budget control in the local unit with respect to the expenses incurred by such local historians. The amendments would also delete the provisions of the bill setting forth a specific term of office for a local historian, since the committee did not believe that such was appropriate in the case of an uncompensated position. The amendments would provide that the local historian would serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority.
