Senate Bill No. 900 requires the Police Training Commission to furnish information on the positive and negative aspects of high speed chases to approved police training schools. The committee feels this is a significant problem, in view of a study by Physicians for Automotive Safety shows that one out of five high speed pursuits end in deaths, and five out of ten pursuits result in serious injury.

The committee amendment deleted the amendment of the Senate County and Municipal Government Committee which gave the Police Training Commission power to promulgate rules and regulations establishing minimum standards for the physical, mental and moral fitness of policemen. The Attorney General is presently reviewing existing standards, and the committee felt that any action in this respect should be deferred until a report is issued by the Department of Law and Public Safety.

Senate Bill No. 900, as received by the committee, would vest the Police Training Commission with the power, responsibility and duty of requiring approved police training schools to provide police officers with information concerning the positive and negative aspects of high speed chases.

The committee amendments would require the commission to furnish such information to such approved schools for inclusion in the regular police training courses and curriculum. The purpose of the amendments is to assure some uniformity in the information provided by the various approved schools in this regard, to integrate this information into the regular courses taken by police recruits, and to remove any implication that such schools would be required to furnish such information to police officers who are not taking police training courses.

In addition, the committee amended the bill to incorporate the provisions of Senate Bill No. 187, previously released by the committee, in order to avoid any inadvertent repeal of such provisions if this bill should become law after that bill.
