AN ACT to designate the aviation hall of fame and museum at Teterboro airport as the Aviation Hall of Fame and Museum of New Jersey.

- 1 WHEREAS, Historic aviation achievements and events in New Jersey
2 are unparalleled by any other state in the Union;
3 WHEREAS, These world acclaimed aviation accomplishments have
4 not been properly memorialized;
5 WHEREAS, Such an oversight of this important New Jersey historic
6 heritage is an injustice to all the citizens of this State;
7 WHEREAS, An aviation hall of fame and museum has been estab-
8 lished at Teterboro airport;
9 WHEREAS, There is now interest in creating a greatly enlarged
10 museum at Teterboro that would encompass the entire history
11 of aviation in this State;
12 WHEREAS, Such a museum would serve an important educational
13 role among the children of this State;
14 WHEREAS, Such a museum would be a major tourist attraction that
15 would enlighten New Jersey's visitors to the importance of the
16 State's role in the development of aviation; now, therefore,

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
2 *of New Jersey:*

- 1 1. The aviation hall of fame and museum at Teterboro airport is
2 designated the Aviation Hall of Fame and Museum of New Jersey.
1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

Governor Brendan Byrne today signed the following bills into law in a public ceremony in his office:

A-361, sponsored by Assemblyman Harold Martin (D-Bergen), which establishes a method for resolving jurisdictional conflicts between New Jersey courts and courts in other states in child custody litigation, and provides for the recognition and enforcement of child custody decrees.

Designated the "Uniform Child Custody Jurisdiction Act", the purpose of the bill is to prevent parental "forum shopping" and "kidnapping" of their children and to eliminate relitigation of child custody awards.

A-1674, sponsored by Assemblywoman Greta Kiernan (D-Bergen), which addresses the needs of the middle-aged woman who has spent most of her adult life working in the home and who now, because of divorce or the death of her spouse, must re-enter the job market.

Under provisions in this bill, the Division on Women will work to identify and provide technical assistance to community organizations which seek to provide for displaced homemakers' job counseling services, job training, health education and counseling, financial management, educational services, legal counseling and referral, outreach and information services. The Division will make a continuous study of the needs of displaced homemakers and recommend effective programs and services to meet those needs, while putting eligible people in touch with the available programs.

S-3005, sponsored by Senator Matthew Feldman (D-Bergen), which designates "The Teterboro Aviation Hall of Fame and Museum" as "The Aviation Hall of Fame and Museum of New Jersey." Atlantic Aviation, Inc., a private concern, provides space for the museum of Teterboro Airport. No state funding has been requested, the museum is merely seeking a change in title.

S-915, also sponsored by Senator Feldman, which exempts Congressional Medal of Honor holders from motor vehicle registration fees. The Division of Motor Vehicles recently issued special license plates to New Jersey's eleven Medal of Honor holders.
