

The purpose of this legislation is to correct certain ambiguities in existing law which might be interpreted to prohibit the manufacture in New Jersey of lottery tickets which are authorized for sale in other jurisdictions.

To insure that further legislative action on this subject would not be necessary when the new criminal code goes into effect, the bill was amended in committee by addition of a new section supplementing Title 2C with the same language that the bill inserts in present Title 2A.
