An Act concerning motor vehicles, amending R. S. 39:3-10.1 and supplementing P. L. 1974, c. 162.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
- 2 of New Jersey:
- 1 1. R. S. 39:3-10.1 is amended to read as follows:
- 2 39:3-10.1. No person shall drive any motor vehicle or trackless
- 3 trolley with a capacity of more than six passengers [and] used for
- 4 the transportation of passengers for hire or for the transportation
- 5 of passengers to or from summer day camps or summer residence
- 6 camps or any bus as defined by the director used for the intrastate
- 7 transportation of passengers, except taxicabs, hotel buses, and
- 8-9 omnibuses used for the transportation of passengers in
- 10 interstate or foreign commerce, or any bus used to transport
- 11 children to and from school pursuant to sections N. J. S.
- 12 18A:39-1 et seq. or when being used by a private school to transport
- 13 children to and from school, unless specially licensed so to do by the
- 14 director. Such license shall not be granted until the applicant
- 15 therefor is at least 18 years of age and has passed a satisfactory
- 16 examination in ascertainment of his driving ability and familiarity
- 17 with the mechanism of said vehicle and has presented evidence,
- 18 satisfactory to the director of his previous experience (including
- 19 proof that he has had at least 3 years of driving experience), good
- 20 character and physical fitness. Said license shall be effective until
- 21 suspended or revoked by the director; provided, the special licensee
- 22 is also the holder of a license as provided for in section 39:3-10
- 23 of this Title.
- 24 Every holder of a special license issued pursuant to this section
- 25 shall furnish to the director satisfactory evidence of continuing
- 26 physical fitness, good character and experience once in every
- 27 24 months after the issuance of the special license.

EXPLANATION—Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets Ithus in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

The director may suspend or revoke a license granted under authority of this section for a violation of any of the provisions of this subtitle, or on other reasonable grounds, or where, in his opinion, the licensee is either physically or morally unfit to retain the same.

The director may make such rules and regulations as he may deem necessary to carry out the provisions of this section.

1 2. (New section) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 2 2 of P. L. 1974, c. 162 (C. 39:3-19.2) or of any other law, no annual registration fee shall be charged for any applicant for a license 3 plate of a "School Vehicle Type II" for any vehicle with a seating 4 capacity of 16 or less which is used to transport children to or from 5 6 summer day camps or summer residence camps from May 15 to September 15 of any year; provided, however, that any such vehicle 7 shall be inspected by the Division of Motor Vehicles prior to May 15 8 of any year in which the vehicle is to be used to transport children 9 10 to or from summer day camps or summer residence camps for 11 compliance with the minimum standards for small vehicles which 12have been adopted by the Department of Education and shall be covered by motor vehicle liability insurance coverage insuring 13 against loss resulting from liability imposed by law for bodily injury or death sustained by any person arising out of the owner-15 ship, maintenance, operation or use of said vehicle wherein such 16 17 coverage shall be at least in: a. an amount or limit of \$300,000.00, 18 exclusive of interest and costs, on account of injury to, or death of, 19 one person, in any one accident; and b. an amount or limit, subject to such limit for any one person so injured or killed, of \$500,000.00, 20exclusive of interest and costs, on account of injury to or death of, 2122more than one person, in any one accident.

3. This act shall take effect immediately.

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STATEMENT

Pursuant to section 2 of P. L. 1974, c. 162 (C. 39:3-19.2) a \$40.00 fee is required annually of certain persons including summer camp operators transporting campers who purchase "School Vehicle Type II" license plates. This bill exempts an operator of any vehicle with a seating capacity of 16 or less which is being used to transport children to or from summer day camps or summer residence camps from May 15 to September 15 of any year from payment of a registration fee of \$40.00 for purchase of such license plates. In addition, this bill requires that every such vehicle being used to transport campers be covered by motor vehicle liability insurance coverage.

The bill also provides that such vehicles be inspected by the Division of Motor Vehicles prior to May 15 of any year in which they are to be used and that they be in compliance with the minimum safety standards for small vehicles that have been established by the Department of Education.

This bill also amends R. S. 39:3-10.1 so that any person driving a vehicle with a capacity of no more than 6 passengers that is being used for the transportation of such passengers to or from summer day camps or summer residence camps shall not be required to be specially licensed by the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles to provide such transportation service.

The statement appended to and printed with the bill adequately explains its provisions as reported.

The committee has received correspondence from the Governor's Advisory Council on Youth Camp Safety endorsing the provisions of the bill and pointing out that the provisions would only apply to 20 to 40 percent of registered camps and that the revenue generated by youth camps is minimal.

The Division of Motor Vehicles has also indicated their support for the bill "since it does not exempt the vehicles from regular registration, nor does it exempt them from any of the safety or insurance requirements." FOR IMPMEDIATE RELEASE

Governor Brendan Byrne today signed the following bills into law in a public ceremony in his office.

A-3019, sponsored by Assemblyman Charles Mays, Sr. (D-Hudson), amends and strengthens the anti-redlining law. The bill amends the definition of an "applicant" to include someone making an "oral-in-person" request for a mortgage loan. This provision helps prevent lenders from discriminatorily discouraging those who request mortgage applications.

The bill further prohibits discrimination "by intent or effect." This provision prohibits certain lending practices which have a particularly adverse impact in urban areas. For example, a policy against making loans on property with more than three dwelling units has the effect of severely limiting the availability of mortgages in the cities, while the suburban impact is not as great.

A-205, sponsored by Assemblyman Richard F. Vistocky (D-Bergen), which amends the "Continuing Pharmaceutical Education Act" to provide that a registered pharmacist affix to the container in which the prescription is dispensed the brand name or generic name of the product dispensed unless the prescriber states otherwise on the original written prescription. This bill will take effect ninety days after enactment.

A-1527, sponsored by Assemblywoman Barbara W. McConnell (D-Hunterdon), exempts from a \$40 annual registration fee for a license plate of a school vehicle any vechile with a seating capacity of less than sixteen used to transport children from summer day camps or summer residence camps from May 15 to September 15 of any year.

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
