STATE OF NEW JERSEY

INTRODUCED JULY 27, 1978

By Senator HAGEDORN

(Without Reference)

AN ACT to amend "An act to provide for the further coordination, facilitation, promotion, preservation and protection of trade and commerce in and through the Port of New York District through the financing and effectuation of industrial development projects therein by the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey, and agreeing with the state of New York with respect thereof," approved (P. L. 1978, c.).

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. Section 20 of P. L. 1978, c. (C.) is amended
2 to read as follows:

3 20. The port authority shall file with the temporary President
4 and Minority Leader of the Senate and the Speaker and Minority
5 Leader of the Assembly of the State of New York and the *President,*
6 *Minority Leader and Secretary of the Senate and the Speaker,*
7 *Minority Leader and Clerk of the General Assembly of the State*
8 *of New Jersey a copy of the minutes of any action taken at any*
9 *meeting of the port authority in connection with any of the pur-*
10 *poses of this act. Such filing must be made at least 10 calendar*
11 *days before such minutes are transmitted to the Governor of each*
12 *state for review; and notice of such filing shall be provided to the*
13 *Governor of each state at the same time.*

14 The temporary President and Minority Leader of the Senate and
15 the Speaker and Minority Leader of the Assembly of the State of
16 New York and the Speaker *and Minority Leader* of the General
17 Assembly and the President *and the Minority Leader* of the Senate
18 of the State of New Jersey, or their representatives designated
19 by them in writing for this purpose, may by certificate filed with
20 the secretary of the port authority waive the foregoing filing
21 requirement with respect to any specific minutes.

1 2. This act shall take effect upon the enactment into law by the
2 State of New York of legislation having an identical effect with
3 this act, but if the State of New York has already enacted such
4 legislation, this act shall take effect immediately.

STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: NOVEMBER 13, 1978

The Assembly Taxation Committee released Senate Bill No. 1278 favorably. This bill was requested by the Minority in the Senate as a condition for their support of the bill enacted on the establishment of Urban Industrial Parks by the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey. It therefore constitutes a measure implementing the pledge made to the minority.

Governor Brendan Byrne has signed the following bills into law:

S-475, sponsored by Senator Joseph A. Maressa (D-Camden), which raises the limit that municipalities may raise and appropriate for the boards of fire commissioners of fire districts or volunteer fire companies from \$30,000 to \$45,000 annually.

In districts with more than three boards or companies, the municipality would be able to appropriate an additional \$15,000 for each additional board or company.

S-1278, sponsored by Senator Garrett W. Hagedorn (R-Bergen), which amends the Port Authority Industrial Parks legislation to include the President, Minority Leader and Secretary of the Senate, and the Speaker, Minority Leader and Clerk of the General Assembly of New Jersey in the list with whom minutes of actions taken by the Port Authority in connection with industrial development projects must be filed.

The legislation already requires such filings with the Senate and Assembly of New York.

The bill requires such filings at least ten days before the minutes are transmitted to the Governor of each state, and notice of such filing must be provided to each Governor at the same time.

S-1394, sponsored by Senator Eugene Bedell (D-Monmouth), which amends the laws dealing with the licensing of ophthalmic dispensers.

The bill provides that in order to qualify for examination and licensure as an ophthalmic dispenser, a candidate must provide the Board of Ophthalmic Dispensers and Ophthalmic Technicians with proof that:

- that he holds a high school diploma, has an associate degree in ophthalmic science or its equivalent and has worked full-time as an apprentice ophthalmic dispenser under the supervision of a licensed ophthalmic dispenser for at least four months prior to taking the examination; or
