# STATE OF NEW JERSEY

INTRODUCED SEPTEMBER 25, 1978

By Assemblymen CALI, ADUBATO, JANISZEWSKI, COWAN, MAYS, PASCULLI and T. GALLO

Referred to Committee on Transportation and Communications

An Act to amend the "Transportation Act of 1966," approved December 12, 1966 (P. L. 1966, c. 301).

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
- 2 of New Jersey:
- 1. Section 5 of P. L. 1966, c. 301 (C. 27:1A-5) is amended to
- 2 read as follows:
- 3 5. The commissioner, as head of the department, shall have all
- 4 of the functions, powers and duties heretofore vested in the State
- 5 Highway Commissioner and shall, in addition to the functions,
- 6 powers and duties invested in him by this act or by any other law:
- 7 (a) Develop, [from time to time revise] and maintain a compre-
- 8 hensive master plan for all modes of transportation development,
- 9 with special emphasis on public transportation [;]. Such plan shall
- 10 be revised and updated at least every 5 years;
- 11 (b) Develop and promote programs to foster efficient and eco-
- 12 nomical transportation services in the State;
- 13 (c) Prepare plans for the preservation and improvement of the
- 14 railroad system, with special emphasis on commuter railroads;
- 15 (d) Develop plans for more efficient public transportation service
- 16 by railroads and motor bus operators; develop statistics, analyses,
- 17 and other data of use to railroad and bus operators in the provision
- 18 of public transportation service; facilitate more effective coordina-
- 19 tion between bus service and other forms of public transportation,
- 20 particularly the commuter railroads; review petitions for motor bus
- 21 franchises in areas served by the commuter railroad system and
- 22 make appropriate recommendations on such petitions[.];
- 23 (e) Coordinate the transportation activities of the department
- 24 with those of other public agencies and authorities;

EXPLANATION—Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

- (f) Cooperate with interstate commissions and authorities, State departments, councils, commissions and other State agencies, with appropriate Federal agencies, and with interested private individuals and organizations in the coordination of plans and policies for the development of air commerce and air facilities; [and]
- 30 (g) Make an annual report to the Governor and the Legislature 31 of the department's operations, and render such other reports as 32 the Governor shall from time to time request or as may be required 33 by law[.]; and
- 34 (h) Promulgate regulations providing for the charging of and 35 setting the amount of fees for certain services performed by and 36 permits issued by the department, including but not limited to the 37 following:
- 38 (1) Providing copies of documents prepared by or in the 39 custody of the department;
- 40 (2) Aeronautics permits;
- 41 (3) Right-of-way permits;
- 42 (4) Traffic signal control systems.
- 1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

Governor Brandam Byrne today signed A-1646, sponsored by Assemblyman John F. Cali (D-Hudson), in a public ceremony in his office today.

The bill amends the Transportation Act of 1966 to direct the Commissioner of Transportation to revise and update the master plan for all modes of transportation development "at least every five years."

Section Five of that Act now requires such action "from time to time."

Signing the bill, the Governor complimented Assemblyman Cali
for his active concern and participation in New Jersey's mass transportation
network. "This bill provides guidelines for our future transportation
needs, while reflecting New Jersey's insistence upon coordinated planning,"
Byrne concluded.

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
