An Acr concerning the regulation of gambling devices, and amending sections 2C:21-18, **2C:37-1,** 2C:37-7 and 2C:37-9 of the New Jersey Statutes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
- 2 of New Jersey:
- 1. N. J. S. 2C:21-18 is amended to read as follows:
- 2 2C:21-18. Slugs. A person is guilty of a petty disorderly persons
- 3 offense when, other than under such circumstances as would con-
- 4 stitute a violation of any of the provisions of the "Casino Control
- 5 Act'' (P. L. 1977, c. 110):
- 6 (1) He inserts or deposits a slug in a coin machine with purpose
- 7 to defraud; or
- 8 (2) He makes, possesses or disposes of a slug with purpose to
- 9 enable a person to insert or deposit it in a coin machine.
- 10 "Slug" means an object or article which, by virtue of its size,
- 11 shape or any other quality is capable of being inserted or deposited
- 12 in a coin machine as an improper substitute for money.

not thereby render material assistance to the establishment, conduct or operation of such game if he performs, without fee or remuneration, acts directed toward the arrangement or facilitation of the game, such as inviting persons to play, permitting the use of premises therefor or supplying cards or other equipment used therein. A person who engages in "bookmaking" as defined in this section is not a "player."

d. "Something of value" means any money or property, any token, object or article exchangeable for money or property, or any form of credit or promise directly or indirectly contemplating transfer of money or property or of any interest therein, or involving extension of a service, entertainment or a privilege of playing at a game or scheme without charge.

e. "Gambling device" means any device, machine, paraphernalia or equipment which is used or usable in the playing phases of any gambling activity, whether such activity consists of gambling between persons or gambling by a person involving the playing of a machine. Notwithstanding the foregoing, lottery tickets, policy slips and other items used in the playing phases of lottery and policy schemes are not gambling devices.

f. "Slot machine" means [a gambling device which, as a result of 40 the insertion of a coin or other object, operates, either completely 41 automatically or with the aid of some physical act by the player, in 42such manner that, depending upon elements of chance, it may 43 eject something of value any mechanical, electrical or other device. 44 contrivance or machine which, upon insertion of a coin, token or 45 similar object therein, or upon payment of any consideration 46 whatsoever, is available to play or operate, the play or operation 4748 of which, whether by reason of the skill of the operator or application of the element of chance, or both, may deliver or entitle the 49 person playing or operating the machine to receive cash or tokens **5**0 to be exchanged for cash, whether the payoff is made automatically 51 from the machine or in any other manner whatsoever. A device so 52constructed, or readily adaptable or convertible to such use, is no 53less a slot machine because it is not in working order or because 54some mechanical act of manipulation or repair is required to 55accomplish its adaptation, conversion or workability. [Nor is it 56 57 any less a slot machine because, apart from its use or adaptability as such, it may also sell or deliver something of value on a basis 58other than chance. A machine which sells items of merchandise 59 60 which are of equivalent value, is not a slot machine merely because such items differ from each other in composition, size, shape or 61 62 color.

The bill also amends the code provisions which permit the possession of a slot machine in the home for social use. Under the terms of the "Casino Control Act," such possession would not be legal.

The purpose of this bill is to remove inconsistencies between the "New Jersey Code of Criminal Justice" and the "Casino Control Act." The bill makes clear that nothing in the code will supersede the provisions of the "Casino Control Act."

The bill also would modify the prohibition against possession of gambling devices under both the code and the "Casino Control Act," to allow for the possession or sale of one or more antique slot machines. Under the bill, antique slot machines are defined as those manufactured before 1941.

The bill would, as well, change the definition of "slot machine" in the penal code to correspond with the definition in the "Casino Control Act" and the regulations adopted pursuant to that act.
