An Act concerning the fees and various fish and game licenses and amending parts of the statutory law.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State

2 of New Jersey:

1 1. R. S. 23:3-4 is amended to read as follows:

23:3-4. The licenses issued under this article shall be as follows: $\mathbf{2}$ 3 a. A license issued to [citizens of the United States] a person 4 above 14 years of age, who [have] has an actual and bona fide 5 domicile in this State at the time of the application for the license 6 and who [have] has had an actual and bona fide domicile in this 7 State for at least 6 months immediately prior thereto, provided that for a residents' trapping [licenses such] license the person 8 [may] shall be above 12 years of age. These licenses shall be of 9 10 five kinds and designated as the residents' firearm hunting license, the residents' bow and arrow license, the residents' trapping li-11 cense, the residents' fishing license and the residents' family fish-12ing license. The Fish and Game Council in the Division of Fish, 13Game and Shell Fisheries of the Department of Environmental 14 Protection shall have the authority to adopt and promulgate regu-15lations for [said] family fishing licenses. 16

17The residents' firearm hunting license shall authorize its holder to hunt with hounds and firearms only, and a fee of [\$10.00] \$13.50 18 and an issuance fee of [\$0.25] \$0.50 shall be charged therefor, 19 20 except that a person 14 or 15 years of age and a person above the age of 65 shall be charged a fee of \$7.00 and an issuance fee of \$0.50. 2122The residents' bow and arrow license shall authorize its holder to 23 hunt with bow and arrow only, and a fee of [\$10.00] \$15.00 and an 24 issuance fee of [\$0.25] \$0.50 shall be charged therefor, except that a person 14 or 15 years of age and a person above the age of 65 25shall be charged a fee of \$8.00 and an issuance fee of \$0.50. The 26EXPLANATION—Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

residents' trapping license shall authorize its holder to trap only, 27and a fee of [\$10.00] \$20.00 and an issuance fee of [\$0.25] \$0.50 28shall be charged therefor, except that a person 12, 13, 14 or 15 years 2930of age shall be charged a fee of \$10.00 and an issuance fee of \$0.50. The residents' fishing license shall authorize its holder to fish only, 3132and a fee of [\$7.00] \$9.00 and an issuance fee of [\$0.25] \$0.50 33shall be charged therefor except that in any case where the appli-34cant is 70 or more years of age and is otherwise qualified no fee 35shall be charged and a person 14 or 15 years of age and a person 36above the age of 65 shall be charged a fee of \$5.00 and an issuance 37fee of \$0.50.

38The residents' family fishing license shall authorize the parents 39or guardians and their children, foster children or wards between the ages of 14 and 18, named therein, to fish only. The fee for the 4041 parent license permitting fishing only by the father or mother, or both, or the guardian shall be \$12.00 with an issuance fee of [\$0.25] 42\$0.50; and each child, foster child or ward named therein shall be 43required to have and shall be issued an individual supplementary 44 license as a member of such family at a fee of \$1.00 and an issu-45ance fee of [\$0.25] \$0.50. The license shall be invalid from the date 46 of its issuance when issued to a person not entitled thereto [here-47under]. Any person, a resident of this State, who is afflicted with 48total blindness, upon application to the Division of Fish, Game and 49Shell Fisheries shall be entitled to a residents' fishing license 50without fee or charge. 51

b. A license issued to a person above 14 years of age not entitled 52to a residents' license, authorizing him to trap or to hunt. These 53licenses shall be designated as the nonresidents' [and aliens'] fire-54arm hunting license, the nonresidents' [and aliens'] bow and arrow 55license, and the nonresidents' [and aliens'] trapping license, and 56the nonresidents' 2-day small game firearm hunting license, except 57that a nonresidents' 2-day small game firearm hunting license shall 58not permit the taking, hunting or killing of deer. 59

The fee for the nonresidents' [and aliens'] firearm hunting license and the nonresidents' [and aliens'] bow and arrow license shall *each*, be [the same as the fees charged to New Jersey residents by the place of residence of the license purchaser for comparable licenses but shall not be less than \$25.00 together with] \$40.00 and an issuance fee of [\$0.25] \$0.50.

67 be \$100.00 and an issuance fee of [\$0.25] \$0.50. The fee for a non-

68 resident's 2-day small game frearm hunting license shall be \$15.00

69 and an issuance fee of \$0.50.

70c. A license issued to a person above 14 years of age not entitled to a residents' license, authorizing him to fish only. These licenses 7172shall be designated as the nonresidents' [and aliens'] fishing license and the nonresidents' [and aliens' 3-day] 7-day vacation 7374fishing license valid for a period of [3] 7 consecutice days [and only obtainable after June 1 of each year]. The fee for these li-7576 censes shall be [\$12.00] \$14.00 for the annual fishing license, to-77 gether with an issuance fee of [\$0.25] \$0.50 and [\$5.00] \$7.00 and 78an issuance fee of [\$0.25] \$0.50 for the [3-day] 7-day vacation 79 fishing license.

Every license issued hereunder shall be void after December 31, next succeeding its issuance excepting the 1-day hunting license which shall expire on the date of issuance, [and] the nonresidents' and [aliens' 3-day] 7-day fishing license which is valid only for [3] 7 consecutive days after date of issuance, and the nonresidents' 2-day small game firearm hunting license which shall expire on the day after the date of issuance.

1 2. Section 2 of P. L. 1951, c. 226 (C. 23:3-4.1) is amended to 2 read as follows:

3 2. The division may, in its discretion, issue a license to a citizen of the United States] person above the age of 14 years authorizing $\mathbf{4}$ him to hunt for 1 day only on areas licensed under subdivisions B. $\mathbf{5}$ and D. of section 23:3-29, or at a shoot to kill field trial which is 6 being held under a proper permit from the division. The fee for 7 this license shall be \$4.00, and an issuance fee of [\$0.25] \$0.50 8 shall be charged therefor. The fees collected hereunder shall be 9 remitted to the State Treasurer, and placed to the credit of the 10 "hunters' and anglers' license fund," and be disbursed by the 11 State Treasurer on vouchers certified to by the division. 12

1 3. Section 1 of P. L. 1959, c. 37 (C. 23:3-56.1) is amended to 2 read as follows:

1. When the Fish and Game Council has established a season 3 for deer of either sex in an area so limited in size that the number 4 of hunters participating in the harvest must be limited and has $\mathbf{5}$ fixed a certain number of licenses to be issued for such harvest, 6 the division is authorized to charge a fee of [\$5.00] \$10.00 for each 7 license so issued, which fee shall be in addition to any other fees 8 authorized by law. No such fee shall be required of the occupant 9 of a farm in this State, who actually resides thereon, or the im-10 mediate members of his family who also reside thereon, provided 11 such person or persons are otherwise authorized to participate in 12such limited harvest. The exemption of this paragraph shall not 13

14 apply to a person residing on the farm or in a tenant house thereon

who is not a member of the occupant's family, nor to a servant ofthe occupant.

1 4. Section 3 of P. L. 1975, c. 117 (C. 23:3-61.3) is amended to 2 read as follows:

FISCAL NOTE TO SENATE, No. 3242

STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: MAY 21, 1979

Senate Bill No. 3242 increases certain fees associated with hunting and fishing in the State and reduces the costs of hunting and fishing licenses for persons over 65 years of age and persons 14 and 15 years of age.

The Department of Environmental Protection estimates that enactment of this legislation would increase the revenues of the Division of Fish, Game and Shellfisheries by \$408,000.00 in fiscal 1979-80 and \$816,000.00 in each of the next 2 fiscal years.

In compliance with written request received, there is hereby submitted a fiscal estimate for the above bill, pursuant to P. L. 1962, c. 27.
