Provisions:

The Assembly Education Committee favorably reports this bill which increases the membership of the boards of trustees of county colleges from 9 to 11, and stipulates that at least two of the 11 shall be women and one shall be a student elected by the student body who shall serve as a non-voting member. The student representative must be from the graduating class.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS:

There are no costs associated with this legislation.

BACKGROUND:

Women Members

Assembly Bill No. 351 would require that at least two members of the county college boards of trustees be women. This follows the pattern established with regard to State college boards by N. J. S. 18A:64-3, which specifies that not less than two members of the board shall be women. At present, of the 18 colleges, eight counties have one, seven counties have two, and three counties have three women on the board of trustees.

Student Members

This bill specifies that the student body of each college shall elect from the graduating class one representative to serve on the board for 1 year term. The student would serve as a non-voting member of the board. In 1977, two county colleges, Essex and Middlesex, had one non-voting student representative on their boards.

Two State colleges, Glassboro and Montclair State, had one non-voting student representative in executive session. At Jersey City, Ramapo and Stockton State Colleges, students may speak at executive sessions by request; however, the board may turn down such requests. At Paterson, students may be invited to attend. Elsewhere, students may not attend executive sessions.

For purposes of information, elected non-voting students and faculty representatives serve with the board of governors and board of trustees of Rutgers University.

Positions on the Proposed Legislation:

The Department of Higher Education supported mandating the inclusion of women on the boards, but opposed the inclusion of students. The Council of County Colleges opposed this legislation.

The Senate Education Committee favorably reports this bill, which requires that at least two members of the county college boards of trustees be women. This follows the pattern established with regard to State college boards by N. J. S. 18A:64—3, which specifies that not less than two members of the board shall be women. At present, of the 18 colleges, six colleges are not in compliance with the intent of this legislation. Of the six, three colleges have vacancies on the board.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS:

The Senate Education Committee amended this bill so that it conforms to the State College Board of Trustees statute. The section relating to students has been deleted. Boards may at present invite students to attend, and a number of State Colleges and Rutgers University do so. However, it was felt inappropriate to mandate the inclusion of students on the boards.

Further, the effective date has been modified so that no board would have to remove a present member in order to comply.

While signing <u>A-351</u>, sponsored by Assemblyman Larl Weidel (R-Mercer), Acting Governor Joseph P. Merlino made the following statement:

This bill would increase the membership of the board of trustees for each county college from nine to eleven, would mandate that at least two of the members be women, would permit the student body of each county college to elect a graduating class student to serve as a non-voting member of the board, and would recognize the existence of a county appointing authority other than the director of the board of freeholders. Similar legislation exists mandating that there be at least two women on the boards of trustees of each State college.

Although I am conscious of the concerns expressed about this bill, in particular, the lack of specification concerning the terms of the two additional members and the rights and duties of the non-voting alumnus member, I respect the judgment of the Legislature and believe that A-351 should be signed at this time rather than returned with recommendations.

I am, therefore, signing A-351 with the understanding that the Legislature will rapidly pass a new bill in the new session to deal with these concerns.

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
