Licenses with photos will be for 3 year periods, as opposed to the 2 year periods for licenses without photos. Thus, the cost of a license with a photo would be up to $\$ 13.50$. The Division of Motor Vehicles is given a 9 month start-up time for putting photos on initial licenses, and is given a 2 year start-up time for putting photos on license renewals.

The photo-license will provide an effective identification for young people, in particular when they are purchasing alcoholic beverages.
The bill will provide a more effective method of identification in cases of alcoholic beverage purchases by young people. The falsification of and illicit transferring of I.D.'s has been a major problem in the enforcement of drinking-age laws. Having a photo-license will help solve this problem and provide an easier, more reliable method for sellers to determine, and for youthful buyers to prove, eligibility for purchasing alcoholic beverages. Along with the mandated county photo-I.D. program, being extended by another bill in this package, the photo-driver's license should result in almost all young people having a government authorized photo-I.D. The bill would also provide, for those who choose it, an ongoing general purpose photo-I.D.

At the option of the applicant, initial driver's licenses issued to persons 21 and over may have a photograph. Effective 2 years from enactment, a person may choose to have a photo-license upon any license renewal.

The Department of Law and Public Safety estimates that enactment of this legislation would require a State expenditure of $\$ 35,754.00$ for 6 months in fiscal 1979-80, and $\$ 67,788.00$ in fiscal 1980-81.

The department further states that any attempt to estimate the net cost of implementation of this bill in fiscal year 1982 is purely speculative because of the impossibility to determine the number of licensees who will seek photo-license renewals at that time. This will become further complicated by the effect of the change from the present 2 year period to a 3 year period for photo-license expiration.

Keeping in mind that there are approximately 4.8 million driver licensees who will be on an alternating 2 year renewal cycle at the time of implementation of Section 4 of this bill, the number of renewal applicants requesting photo-licenses may run from as little as 200,000 or 300,000 to as much as a maximum of 2.4 million. The following estimate is based on $40 \%$ of the maximum possible renewals plus initial 17 year olds.

The director shall issue licenses for the following license period on and after the first day of the calendar month immediately preceding the commencement of such period, such licenses to be effective immediately.
All applications for renewals of licenses shall be made on forms prescribed by the director[, which forms shall be mailed by the director from the central office of the division to the last addresses of the licensed drivers as they appear on the records of the division.

74 Upon the return by mail of such forms, accompanied by the requisite fees, the director shall issue renewals of such licenses by mail from the central office of the division. 1 and in accordance with procedures established by him.

The director in his discretion may refuse to grant a license to drive motor vehicles to a person who is, in his estimation, not a proper person to be granted such a license, but no defect of the applicant shall debar him from receiving a license unless it can be shown by tests approved by the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles that the defect incapacitates him from safely operating a motor vehicle.

A person violating this section shall be subject to a fine not exceeding $\$ 500.00$ or imprisonment in the county jail for not more than 60 days.

Nothing in this section shall be construed to alter or extend the expiration of any license issued prior to the date this amendatory and supplementary act becomes operative.

## STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: MAY 3, 1979

This bill is part of the package of youth/alcohol legislation developed as a result of the work of the Assembly Judiciary, Law, Public Safety and Defense Committee.

This bill requires that a photograph of the licensee be on all initial driver's licenses issued to persons under 21. At the option of the applicant, initial driver's licenses issued to persons 21 and over may have a photograph. Effective 2 years from enactment, a person may choose to have a photo-license upon any license renewal.

The charge for the photo on the license will be no more than $\$ 1.50$, over and above the regular cost of the license. The regular cost of a license is $\$ 4.00$ per year. Licenses with photos will be for 3 year periods, as opposed to the 2 year periods for licenses without photos. Thus, the cost of a license with a photo would be up to $\$ 13.50$. The Division of Motor Vehicles is given a 9 month start-up time for putting photos on initial licenses, and is given a 2 year start-up time for putting photos on license renewals.

The photo-license will provide an effective identification for young people, in particular when they are purchasing alcoholic beverages.

The falsification of and illicit transferring of I.D.'s has been a major problem in the enforcement of drinking-age laws. Having a photolicense will help solve this problem and provide an easier, more reliable method for sellers to determine, and for youthful buyers to prove, eligibility for purchasing alcoholic beverages. Along with the mandated county photo-I.D. program, being extended by another bill in this package, the photo-driver's license should result in almost all young people having a government authorized photo-I.D. The bill would also provide, for those who choose it, an ongoing general purpose photo-I.D.
