#### PRE-FILED FOR INTRODUCTION IN THE 1978 SESSION

## STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: JANUARY 18, 1979

This bill provides for the escheat to the general treasury of unclaimed pension payments which remain unclaimed for a period of 5 years. The procedure for escheating the funds to the State would be in accordance with the provisions of the Absolute Escheat Act (N. J. S. A. 2A:37–11 et seq.) except that the grounds for escheat would be 5 years instead of 14 years.

Further, the bill repeals N. J. S. A. 2A:37-46 and N. J. S. A. 2A:37-47, a law that provides for the escheat of unclaimed pension funds to the pension fund from which the payments were made.

#### COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

Committee amendments were found necessary to facilitate administration of the bill and are included at the suggestion of the Division of Pensions. The amendments more clearly define what is meant by the term unclaimed pension to include any accounts, pensions or allowances. Further to facilitate determination of the 5 year period, a year is defined to be a "fiscal year" commencing July 1 and ending June 30.

#### ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 267

To the General Assembly:

Pursuant to Article V, Section I, Paragraph 14(b) of the Constitution, I herewith return Assembly Bill No. 267 with my objections for reconsideration.

This bill would provide for the escheat of unclaimed pension payments held in State-administered retirement systems. If the whereabouts of a person remained unknown for 5 successive years, or if the pension payment remained unchanged for such period, the matter would be referred by the Director of Pensions to the Attorney General who in turn would institute an escheat action in the name of the State. The action would allow a person having an interest in the money to make a claim for recovery within 2 years after the filing of a final judgment of escheat.

I believe the intent of the bill is commendable. The method of escheat which the bill would authorize causes me some concern, however. Title 2A of the New Jersey Statutes establishes two procedures by which the State may obtain judgment of escheat. The first or traditional method would be authorized by this bill and would give the State absolute title to the escheated property two years after judgment.

There is a preferable alternative method which has two advantages. It provides for an administratively simpler summary action to obtain a judgment and, more importantly, provides that the State Treasurer may refund a legitimate pension claim at any time. No person, therefore, would be denied their legitimate pension even though, by mistake or inadvertance, they had failed to make a timely claim.

Accordingly I herewith return Assembly Bill No. 267 for reconsideration and recommend that it be amended as follows:

Page 1, Section 1, Lines 1-11: Delete in its entirety and insert the following:

#### 1. As used in this act:

- a. "Pension payment" means and includes inactive accounts, pensions, and allowances due and payable to a member or former member of a State-administered pension or retirement system, or to his survivors or estate.
- b. "Years" means fiscal years commencing July 1 and ending June 30.
- Page 1, Section 2, Line 4: Delete "unchanged" and insert "unclaimed or inactive"
- Page 1, Section 2, Lines 5-8: After "years," delete in its entirety and insert:

the pension payment shall be presumed abandoned and subject to delivery to the State Treasurer for safekeeping in accordance with sections 5, 6, 7, 10 and 11 of P.L. 1967, c. 135 (c. 2A:37-31, 32,.33, 36, 41, and 43).
