INTRODUCED APRIL 27, 1978

An Act concerning the licensing of drivers in certain cases and amending R. S. 39:3-13.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State $\mathbf{2}$ of New Jersey:

1 1. R. S. 39:3-13 is amended to read as follows:

 $\mathbf{2}$ 39:3-13. The director may, in his discretion, issue to a person over 17 years of age an examination permit, under the hand and 3 4 seal of the director, allowing such person, for the purpose of fitting himself to become a licensed driver, to operate a designated class $\mathbf{5}$ of motor vehicles for a specified period of not more than 90 days, 6 while in the company and under the supervision of a driver licensed 7 to operate such designated class of motor vehicles. The permit 8 9 shall be sufficient license for the person to operate such designated 10class of motor vehicles in this State during the period specified, while in the company of and under the control of a driver licensed 11 by this State to operate such designated class of motor vehicles. 12Such person, as well as the licensed driver, shall be held accountable 1314for all violations of this subtitle committed by such person while in the presence of the licensed driver. 15

No examination for a driver's license shall be given unless the 16applicant has first secured a special learner's permit or examina-1718 tion permit and no road test shall be scheduled for an applicant who has secured an examination permit until at least [20] *[10]* 19*20* days shall have elapsed following the validation of the exam-20ination permit for practice driving*, except that in the case of an 2121A omnibus or school bus endorsement no road test shall be scheduled 21B until at least 10 days shall have elapsed*.

22 Every applicant for an examination permit to qualify for an 23omnibus endorsement or an articulated vehicle endorsement must $\mathbf{24}$ be a holder of a valid basic driver's license.

EXPLANATION—Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

25The required fees for special learners permits and examination permits shall be as follows: 26Basic driver's license 27 \$5.00 28 Motorcycle license or endorsement 5.0029Articulated vehicle endorsement 15.00 30 31 The specified period for which a permit is issued may be extended 32for not more than an additional 60 days, without payment of added fee upon application made by the holder thereof where the holder 33 has applied to take the examination for a driver's license prior to 34the expiration of the original period for which the permit was 3536 issued and the director was unable to schedule an examination 37 during said period.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

This bill, as amended by the committee, reduces the minimum period of time that must elapse before a road test may be scheduled for a holder of an examination permit of an omnibus or school bus endorsement from 20 days to 10 days. The committee also amended the bill to maintain the present mandatory waiting period of 20 days for any holder of an examination permit for a basic driver's license, a motorcycle license or endorsement and an articulated vehicle endorsement.

A representative of the Division of Motor Vehicles noted that the division has no difficulties with the bill as amended in committee.

DATED: JANUARY 18, 1979

This bill would change the period of time a holder of a driver's examination permit must wait before having a road test scheduled. The existing period is 20 days which would be changed to 10 days under the bill.

The committee felt that in many instances there is no need to make an applicant wait longer than the ten day period before being permitted to apply for a test. A representative of the Division of Motor Vehicles expressed reservations indicating that the bill might result in increased costs.
