AN ACT to repeal P. L. 1978, c. 129 *and supplementing Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes*.*

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 *1. *a. Any funds received for the school years 1975-76 through*
2 *1979-80, inclusive, by a regional school district pursuant to section 2*
3 *of the Federal Impact Financial Assistance Act (P. L. 81-874) shall*
4 *be applied in the proportions set forth hereinafter as a tax credit*
5 *to offset any amounts due to that regional school district from the*
6 *municipality in which is located the Federal land for which such*
7 *payments are made:*

8 (1) *For the 1975-76 school year—100%;*

9 (2) *For the 1976-77 school year—80%;*

10 (3) *For the 1977-78 school year—60%;*

11 (4) *For the 1978-79 school year—40%; and*

12 (5) *For the 1979-80 school year—20%.*

13 *b. Any such funds received by any regional school district for*
14 *which credit has not been granted to a municipality shall be applied*
15 *as a tax credit against the municipality's portion of the regional*
16 *school cost equally over a 4-year period beginning with the 1980-81*
17 *school year.*

18 *c. Any credit not applied in any given school year shall be car-*
19 *ried forward and applied as a credit toward any moneys due in the*

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

This bill repeals the law which provided that municipalities which were the basis for certain Federal aid to regional school districts for impacted areas receive credit for such aid against amounts due to the school district from the municipality.

STATE OF NEW JERSEY

ADOPTED DECEMBER 17, 1979

Amend page 1, title, line 1, after "129", insert "and supplementing Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes".

Amend page 1, section 1, line 1, insert new section 1 as follows:

"1. a. Any funds received for the school years 1975-1976 through 1979-80, inclusive, by a regional school district pursuant to section 2 of the Federal Impact Financial Assistance Act (P. L. 81-874) shall be applied in the proportions set forth hereinafter as a tax credit to offset any amounts due to that regional school district from the municipality in which is located the Federal land for which such payments are made:

- (1) For the 1975-76 school year—100%;
- (2) For the 1976-77 school year—80%;
- (3) For the 1977-78 school year—60%;
- (4) For the 1978-79 school year—40%; and
- (5) For the 1979-80 school year—20%.

b. Any such funds received by any regional school district for which credit has not been granted to a municipality shall be applied as a tax credit against the municipality's portion of the regional school cost equally over a 4-year period beginning with the 1980-81 school year.

c. Any credit not applied in any given school year shall be carried forward and applied as a credit toward any moneys due in the next ensuing year or years.

d. The balance of the moneys so received and any moneys so received for the school year 1980-81 and all succeeding school years shall be retained by the regional school district and applied to its current expenses consistent with the applicable Federal regulations."

Amend page 1, section 1, line 1, omit "1", insert "2".

Amend page 1, section 2, line 1, omit "2", insert "3".

FEBRUARY 8, 1980

A-3244, sponsored by Assemblyman Albert Burstein (D-Bergen), which permits the Director of the Division of Purchase and Property and the Director of the Division of Building and Construction to award contracts for building construction or repair projects up to \$10,000 "in any manner which they may deem effective to promote full and free competition whenever competition is practicable," i.e., without bidding.

The bill also permits the award of contracts for construction materials and supplies up to \$7,000 without bidding. Formerly, bidding was required on all contracts over \$2,500. The \$2,500 threshold was in effect since 1954.

S-792, sponsored by Senator Walter Foran (R-Hunterdon), which makes several technical changes in the law pertaining to well drillers.

The most significant change in the statute gives well drillers the statutory authority to install pumps in wells. Formerly, electricians had to perform this routine every time a pump was installed.

A-1694, sponsored by Assemblyman Buddy Fortunato (D-Essex), which requires the installation of smoke detectors or smoke alarms or both in hotels and multiple dwellings.

Rules and regulations will be issued by the Commissioner of Community Affairs to specify the number, location, specifications, maintenance and periodic testing of smoke detectors and smoke alarms.

A-902, sponsored by Assemblyman Walter Kern, Jr. (R-Bergen), which governs the jurisdiction of the county district court with respect to those of its judgement which have been docketed in the Superior Court.

This bill expands the district court's jurisdiction to include any matter affecting the validity of an original judgement, except for execution.

A-3662, sponsored by Assemblyman Robert E. Littell (R-Sussex), which repeals P.L. 1978, c. 129, which required regional school districts receiving federal funds under the Federal Impact Financial Assistance as a consequence of property having been taken by the federal government, to credit the constituent school district in which the property is located.

This bill, instead, establishes a specific formula for tax credits to offset amounts due to the regional school district from the municipality in which the federal land is located.
