#### STATEMENT

The purpose of this bill is to mandate the development of data which would contribute a rational, objective assessment of the relation between drinking and social problems, especially as related to youth. Decision-making about the appropriate drinking age, restrictions upon drinking and penalties for violations of drinking laws, has been hampered by the absence of centralized and coordinated data collection and analysis.

This bill also adds certain members of the New Jersey Cabinet to the Advisory Council on Alcoholism in order to conform to recent reorganizational adjustments in State Government. In addition the bill increases the total number of citizen members of the advisory council from 8 to 12 persons and provides for representation from various minority groups as called for by the Federal Government in Public Law 91-616—which is a prerequisite for eligibility for Federal grants. This legislation also extends ex officio membershp to the member of the State Health Planning and Coordinating Council serving on the Advisory Council on Alcoholism.

This bill is part of a package of youth/alcohol bills prepared as a result of the work of the Assembly Judiciary, Law, Public Safety and Defense Committee.

The purpose of this bill is to develop a high-level, ongoing system of data on alcohol problems, and especially as related to youth. This system would contribute to the effective monitoring of alcohol laws and to the ongoing attempt to deal with the personal and social problems connected with alcohol abuse.

This bill also adds certain members of the New Jersey Cabinet to the Advisory Council on Alcoholism in order to conform to recent reorganizational adjustments in State Government. In addition the bill increases the total number of citizen members of the advisory council from 8 to 12 persons and provides for representation from various minority groups as called for by the Federal Government in Public Law 91-616—which is a prerequisite for eligibility for Federal grants. This legislation also extends ex officio membership to the member of the State Health Planning and Coordinating Council serving on the Advisory Council on Alcoholism.

## STATE OF NEW JERSEY

This bill is part of a package of youth/alcohol bills prepared as a result of a study by the Assembly Judiciary, Law, Public Safety and Defense Committee.

This bill amends P. L. 1975, c. 305 (C. 26:2B-7 et seq.) to require the Department of Health to collect, analyze and distribute data on the incidence of alcohol use and alcohol-related problems in New Jersey, especially among juveniles.

The bill also increases the size of the Advisory Council on Alcoholism within the Division on Alcoholism from 15 to 22 members by adding the Commissioners of Corrections and Higher Education, one representative from the Statewide Health Coordinating Council, and four additional citizen members (from 8 to 12) to insure inclusion of black. hispanic, women and youth representatives. The committee recognizes that alcoholism also can be a serious problem for the elderly and urges that consideration be given to this segment of the population when the additional citizen participants are selected.

The committee amended this bill to mandate the Department of Health rather than the Advisory Council on Alcoholism to maintain the statistical data system because it felt that such a mandate is more appropriate at the department level.
