19:5-3. The members of the county committees of political par-2

3 ties shall be elected annually at the primary for the general elec-

4 tion in the manner provided in this Title for the selection of party

candidates to be voted for at the general election by voters of a 5

municipality. The county committee shall consist of one male and 6

7 one female member from each unit of representation in the county.

The male receiving the highest number of votes among the male

candidates and the female receiving the highest number of votes 9

among the female candidates shall be declared elected. Members 10

of the county committee shall actually reside in the districts or units 11

which they respectively represent. The county committee shall de-12
