1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

This bill permits a municipal council of any "Mayor-Council Plan C" municipality with a population in excess of 250,000 to fix salaries for municipal council aides. Under existing law, such salaries may not exceed \$7,500.00 which given current rates of inflation may not be sufficient to attract talented persons to municipal service.

SENATE, No. 905

STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: APRIL 27, 1978

Senate Bill No. 905 would provide that municipalities having a population in excess of 250,000 and operating under the "Mayor-Council Plan C" of the "Optional Municipal Charter Law" may fix, by ordinance, the salary to be paid to municipal council aides.

Under current law the salary of municipal council aide is limited at \$7,500.00 or less. The municipal council may appoint not more than one aide per councilman, to serve at his pleasure.

The bill pertains to only two municipalities: Newark and Jersey City.
