An Act concerning county detectives and amending N. J. S. 2A:157-4.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
- 2 of New Jersey:
- 1 1. N. J. S. 2A:157-4 is amended to read as follows:
- 2 2A:157-4. a. In counties of the second class having a population
- 3 in excess of [460,000] 500,000 there may be appointed not in ex-
- 4 cess of 28 county detectives, of whom one may be designated chief
- 5 of county detectives, one captain of county detectives, six lieuten-
- 6 ants of county detectives and four sergeants of county detectives.
- 7 b. In counties of the second class having a population between
- 8 460,000 and 500,000 there may be appointed not in excess of 28
- 9 county detectives, of whom one may be designated chief of county
- 10 detectives, one deputy chief of county detectives, four captains
- 11 of county detectives and six lieutenants of county detectives.
- 12 [b.] c. In counties of the second class having a population be-
- 13 tween 400,000 and 460,000, there may be appointed not in excess
- 14 of 24 county detectives, of whom one may be designated chief of
- 15 county detectives, one captain of county detectives, [and] four
- 16 lieutenants of county detectives, and two [may be designated]
- 17 sergeants of county detectives.
- 18 [c.] d. In the counties of the second class having a population
- 19 of 400,000 or under, there may be appointed not in excess of 12
- 20 county detectives of whom one may be designated chief of county
- 21 detectives, one captain of county detectives, and one lieutenant of

- 23 [d.] e. Their annual salaries shall be fixed as follows: chief
- 24 of county detectives, not less than \$9,500.00; deputy chief of county

STATEMENT

This bill authorizes any county of the second class with a population of between 460,000 and 500,000 (i.e., Passaic County) to appoint a deputy chief of county detectives and three additional captains of county detectives. The bill does not change the maximum number of county detectives who may be appointed by such county.
