An Act concerning the appointment of county court judges in certain counties and supplementing article 2 of chapter 3 of Title 2A of the New Jersey Statutes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State

- 1. In counties having a population of more than 400,000 but less
- 2 than 460,000 according to the 1970 census, there shall be seven
- 3 judges of the county court in addition to the judge of the county

Governor Brendan Byrne Friday signed S-1455, sponsored by Senator Joseph A. Maressa, D-Camden, which provides for the appointment of two additional county court judges in Camden County.

A comparison with Essex, Middlesex and Warren counties shows that Camden has a high caseload per judge. Essex has a per judge caseload of 1,006, Middlesex's caseload is 950, and Warren's caseload is 858. Camden currently has a caseload of 1,317.

The bill is intended to help lighten the per judge caseload.
