PRE-FILED FOR INTRODUCTION IN THE 1976 SESSION

By Assemblyman CODEY

AN ACT concerning certain activities by legislative agents and supplementing the "Legislative Activities Disclosure Act of 1971," approved June 2, 1971 (P. L. 1971, c. 183).

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*  
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. Any legislative agent who knowingly causes, influences, or  
2 otherwise secures the introduction of any legislation or amend-  
3 ment thereto for the purpose of thereafter being employed to  
4 prevent the passage thereof, shall upon conviction be guilty of a  
5 misdemeanor.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

Assembly Bill No. 998 would make it a misdemeanor (punishable by a maximum fine of \$1,000.00 and/or a maximum prison term of 6 years) for lobbyists to have legislation or amendments thereto introduced in the Legislature for the purpose of being employed to lobby against such measures.
