# STATE OF NEW JERSEY

#### PRE-FILED FOR INTRODUCTION IN THE 1976 SESSION

By Assemblyman CODEY

An Act providing penalties for persons employing unregistered agents and supplementing the "Legislative Activities Disclosure Act of 1971," approved June 2, 1971 (P. L. 1971, c. 183).

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
- 2 of New Jersey:
- 1. Any person who knowingly employs another person to serve
- 2 as a legislative agent who is not registered as required by section 4
- 3 of the act of which this act is a supplement, except upon the con-
- 4 dition that such person register as a legislative agent as provided
- 5 by law or who continues to employ any such person who has not
- 6 registered within the time required by law, shall, upon conviction,
- 7 be guilty of a misdemeanor.
- 1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

#### STATEMENT

This bill would penalize any employer of a legislative agent unless such agent complies with the registration requirements of the "Legislative Activities Disclosure Act."

Assembly Bill No. 999 would make it a misdemeanor (punishable by a maximum fine of \$1,000.00 and/or a maximum prison term of 6 years) for any person to employ someone to serve as a lobbyist who has not registered or does not register as a lobbyist as required by the "Legislative Activities Disclosure Act."
