An Act to amend the title of "An act concerning medical service corporations and regulating the establishment, maintenance and operation of medical service corporations and medical service plans, and supplementing Title 17 of the Revised Statutes by adding thereto a new chapter entitled 'Medical Services Corporations,' " approved May 29, 1940 (P. L. 1940, c. 74), so that the same shall read "An act concerning medical service corporations and regulating the establishment, maintenance and operation of medical service corporations, and supplementing Title 17 of the Revised Statutes by adding thereto a new chapter entitled 'Medical Services Corporations,'" to amend the body of said act, and to amend P. L. 1964, c. 1.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 1. The title of P. L. 1940, c. 74 is amended to read as follows:

An act concerning medical service corporations and regulating the establishment, maintenance and operation of medical service corporations [and medical service plans], and supplementing Title 17 of the Revised Statutes by adding thereto a new chapter entitled "Medical Service Corporations."

1 2. Section 1 of P. L. 1940, c. 74 (17:48A-1) is amended to read 2 as follows:

3 1. As used in this act the following words and phrases shall4 have the following meanings:

A medical service corporation is any corporation organized,
without capital stock, and not for profit, for the purpose of establishing, maintaining and operating nonprofit medical service plans,
or to provide or pay for medical services on the basis of premiums
or other valuable considerations. A nonprofit medical service plan
EXPLANATION—Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

10is any plan or arrangement operated by a medical service corporation, under the provisions of this act, and whereby the expense of 11medical services to subscribers and other covered dependents is 12paid in whole or in part by the corporation to participating 1314 physicians of such plans or arrangements and to others as provided herein. A subscriber is a person to whom a subscription certificate 1516is issued by the corporation and which sets forth the kinds and 17 extent of the medical services for which the corporation is liable 18to make payment and which constitutes the contract between the 19subscriber and the corporation. A covered dependent is the spouse, an adult dependent or a child of the subscriber who is named in 2021the subscription certificate issued to the subscriber and with respect 22to whom appropriate premium is specified in the certificate. A 23participating physician is any physician licensed to practice 24medicine and surgery in the State of New Jersey pursuant to 25chapter 9, Title 45, of the Revised Statutes, who agrees in writing with the corporation to perform the medical services specified in 2627the subscription certificates issued by the corporation and at such 28rates of compensation as shall be determined by its board of trustees 29and who agrees to abide by the bylaws, rules and regulations of 30 the corporation applicable to participating physicians. Medical 31service includes all general and special medical, dental and surgical 32services ordinarily provided by such licensed physicians and by others as provided herein in accordance with accepted practices 33in the community at the time the service is rendered. No subscriber 3435or his covered dependents shall be liable for any payment to any 36participating physician for medical services specified in the sub-37scriber's certificate to be paid to the participating physician by the 38corporation.

1 3. Section 1 of P. L. 1964, c. 1 (17:48A-28) is amended to read as 2 follows:

3 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of the act to which this $\mathbf{4}$ act is a supplement, benefits shall not be denied to an eligible individual for eligible services when such services are performed 56 or rendered such persons [in an approved hospital] by a licensed dentist within the scope of his practice *and a medical service 7corporation under this act may issue separate contracts covering 8 the services of licensed dentists*. The practice of dentistry shall 9 10be deemed to be within the provisions of the act to which this act is a supplement and licensed dentists shall have the privileges and 11 12benefits in the scope of their practice under such act as are afforded 13thereunder to licensed physicians and surgeons in the scope of their practice. 14

1 4. This act shall take effect immediately.

DATED: SEPTEMBER 27, 1976

This legislation would permit medical service corporations to offer dental coverage to subscribers and to contract with participating dentists. At present, such corporations have authority to provide such services only when rendered in a hospital.

The committee amendment clarifies their authority to issue separate contracts covering dental services.

Governor Brendan Byrne today signed A-1968, spensored by Assemblyman Vincent Ozzie Pellecchia, (D-Passaic).

The bill allows medical service corporations to write dental service coverages whether or not they are included as part of a medical service plan and whether or not the services are performed in an approved hospital.

The bill permits Group Health Insurance of New Jersey (GHT) and Blue Shield to write the type of coverage. Previously, only the New Jersey Dental Service Plan was able to do this.

According to the Department of Insurance, this bill is an important first step toward creating a more competitive environment in the health service field.
