An Act concerning county colleges and amending N. J. S. 18A:64A-22.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
- 2 of New Jersey:
- 1 1. N. J. S. 18A:64A-22 is amended to read as follows:
- 2 18A:64A-22. Annual budget requests for State support of
- 3 colleges. The Board of Higher Education shall formulate annual
- 4 budget requests for State support of county colleges. Within the
- 5 limits of funds appropriated to the Board of Higher Education for
- 6 such purposes and in accordance with rules and regulations pre-
- 7 scribed by the Board of Higher Education, the board of trustees
- 8 of a county college may apply to the Board of Higher Education

- 10 a. For capital projects approved by the Board of Higher Educa-

Provisions:

This bill increases the maximum for State aid to county colleges from \$600.00 to \$700.00 per equated full-time equivalent students.

BACKGROUND:

The original intent of the Legislature was that the State should provide 50% of the funds for the county colleges. The \$600.00 limit was established in 1966. Since that time, costs have risen considerably, so that even by increasing the maximum to \$700.00, the State will not be providing 50% of the cost, which is approximately \$1,600.00 per equated FTE student.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS:

In recommending an increase in State funding for the colleges, the committee felt that certain courses should not be funded by the State. These would include non-credit courses which are non-remedial or developmental in nature. The amendments would eliminate State funds for avocational courses and such other non-credit courses as "a concert, film, tour, art show, therapy or self-realization sessions..." (N. J. A. C. 9:4–3.57(b)1.viii (A), Department of Higher Education proposed regulations.)

In supporting this limitation and the increase in funding for the county colleges, the committee realizes that this is not a complete solution to the problem and issues associated with county college funding. The Department of Higher Education has advised the committee that it is developing a new funding formula. It is the intention of the committee to request a speedy resolution on this matter by the Department, and, further, to review that formula in detail after it is adopted by the board.

Governor Brendan Byrne signed a bill Wednesday which increases the limit for state support for county college operational costs from \$600 to \$700 per equated full-time (FTE) student.

The bill, #-3182, was sponsored by Assemblyman Daniel Newman, D-Ocean.

Its signing makes the statutory limit on the amount of state

FTE appropriations to county colleges consistent with the Fiscal Year

1977-78 budget.

Under the original FY 77-78 budget, FTE appropriations for county colleges were set at \$600, a limit established by statute in 1966.

However, the Joint Appropriations Committee, in its review of the Higher Education Budget for the coming fiscal year, increased the figure to \$700 per FTE student.

An FTE student is a term used for funding purposes for all

New Jersey higher education institutions. In order to determine the

number of FTE's, the institution adds the total number of student credits

for the academic year and divides that figure by the average course load

per student.

The bill is effective immediately and requires no additional appropriation outside of the FY 77-78 budget.

Governor Byrne signed the measure at Ocean County Community College.
