INTRODUCED SEPTEMBER 16, 1976

AN ACT concerning the appointment of county court judges in certain counties and supplementing article 2 of chapter 3 of Title 2A of the New Jersey Statutes.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*  
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. In counties of the third class having a population of more  
2 than 50,000 but less than 65,000 according to the 1970 census, there  
3 shall be one judge of the county court in addition to the judge of  
4 the county court provided by Article VI, Section V, paragraph 2  
5 of the Constitution, making two in all in each of said counties, to be  
6 nominated and appointed by the Governor with the advice and  
7 consent of the Senate.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

**STATEMENT**

The purpose of this bill is to provide for the appointment of one additional county court judge in counties of the third class having a population of 50,000 but less than 65,000 according to the 1970 census.
