Such resolution shall be written or printed on 7 notices together with a statement of the time and place where the meeting of such legal voters will be held and the purpose and object 8 9 thereof. The time and place for the holding of such election shall 10 be the same as the annual election of water commissioners and for the appropriation of moneys for water purposes in said district, 11 or a special election may be called for the purpose. Not less than 1213 10 notices of such meeting shall be posted by the clerk of the water commissioners at least 10 days before the date thereof in such 14 15 manner and in such public places as he shall deem best for the purpose of giving notice of said meeting, and the board of water 16 17 commissioners and the clerk shall "[at their option]" also cause notices *[or a notice] * to be printed as an advertisement in a paper 18 19 published in the district if there be one, and if not, in a paper published within the county where the district is located and 2021circulating in said district. The legal voters of any such water district may, at the 3 4election at which such proposition is submitted, by the vote of a majority of those voting, authorize the board of water commis-5 sioners to issue bonds for the purpose set forth in section 30 6 7 of this act. Such bonds shall be serial bonds and shall be issued 8 in the corporate name of such water district for such sums not 9 exceeding [an aggregate of \$60,000.00 and not exceeding] the sum 10 voted as aforesaid, and in such amounts and payable at such times 11 as the legal voters so voting shall direct, with interest at a rate [not exceeding 6% per annum] as such resolution or resolutions 1213 authorizing the issuance of such bonds shall provide, payable halfyearly. Said bonds shall not be issued for a longer period than 14 30 years. Such bonds shall be signed by the president of the board 15 of water commissioners and attested by the secretary of the board 16 17 who shall affix the seal of said commissioners. STATEMENT

The law which this bill amends was enacted in 1951 and contains monetary limitations with respect to the isnance of bonds which because of inflation and other economic factors are very much outdated. The changes this bill proposes will not cause any undue hardship to the residents and taxpayers within any water district, since any bonds issued by a water commission must be approved by the legal voters residing within such district at any election for that purpose. If the residents of any water district feel that it will be in their best interest to levy a tax upon themselves to provide for an adequate supply of water, they should be permitted to do so just as the taxpayers of a Type II school district may do to provide educational facilities.

Assembly Bill No. 3236 would remove the limitation of \$60,000.00 on the amount a township water district could spend to acquire certain equipment, and to construct certain plants and structures. The cost of such acquisition, construction and operation would be financed by a bond issue, and would have to be authorized by resolution and approved by the voters of the district at a special meeting for which public notice is required. The bill also removes the 6% interest limitation on such bonds. The resolution would specify the amount of the bond issue and the interest to be paid on the bonds.

Only two townships in the State have water districts. These are Sparta township in Sussex county and Voorhees township in Camden county.

The committee amendments, as approved by the sponsor, would remove the implication of the language of the original bill that operating expenses would be financed by bond issues. Operating expenses of water districts are currently financed through special assessments on the residents of the district, pursuant to section 25 of P. L. 1951, c. 280 (C. 40:62–105.25). The amendments assure that operating expenses would continue to be financed through special assessments, and would assure that bond revenues could not be raised for that purpose.

In addition, the committee amendments would require that notice of a special meeting of the voters of the water district to approve such a bond resolution be printed in a newspaper. This would bring the provisions of the statutes relating to water districts into line with the provisions of the "Local Bond Law" (N. J. S. 40A:2-1 et seq.). Currently, such newspaper notice is optional for these water districts.

Governor Brendan Byrne has signed the following bills into law:

<u>S-3241</u> - sponsored by Senator William V. Musto, D-Hudson, which
authorizes the Lottery Commission to allow licensed lottery agents to
pay prizes not exceeding \$599 out of money received from the sale of
lottery tickets or shares.

The bill is intended to place New Jersey on an equal competitive basis with neighboring states in allowing prize payments in the field.

The bill also allows prizes to be provided more quickly and conveniently.

A-3236 - sponsored by Assemblyman Robert E. Littell, R-Sussex, which amends the law concerning the issuance of water district bonds.

The bill removes the limitation of \$60,000 on the amount a township water district can spend to acquire certain equipment, and to construct certain plants and structures. The cost of such acquisition and construction will be financed by bond issues. These bond issues must be authorized by resolution and approved by the voters of the district at a special meeting. The legislation requires that notice of the special meetings be printed in a newspaper.

The bill also removes the six per cent interest limitation on the bonds.

Sparta Township in Sussex County and Voorhees Township in Camden

County are the only two townships in the state which have water districts.

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
