5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
6 of New Jersey:

8 1. a. A county board of chosen freeholders may, by resolution,
9 establish a mosquito control reserve fund. Unexpended balances
10 budgeted annually for mosquito control may be lapsed into the
11 reserve. Upon passage of a resolution of the board of chosen
12 freeholders, funds in the reserve may be used for any purpose
13 related to mosquito population control by the county after current
14 budget appropriations for that purpose, if any exist, have been
15 expended.

16 b. The Local Finance Board is authorized to adopt rules and
17 regulations, pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act,"
18 P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), in order to effectuate the
19 purposes of this section.

26 This bill authorizes a county board of chosen freeholders to

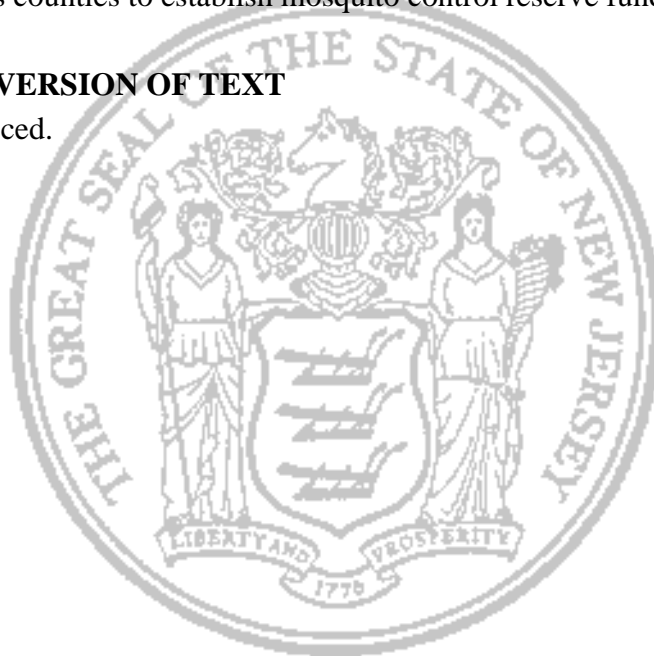
