

STATE OF NEW JERSEY

INTRODUCED AUGUST 12, 1976

By Senator DUMONT

Referred to Committee on County and Municipal Government

AN Act to amend "A supplement to 'An act authorizing the State of New Jersey to participate in a Federal program of flood control, making an appropriation for the same purpose,' approved September 8, 1948 (P. L. 1948, c. 351)," approved June 5, 1957 (P. L. 1957, c. 67).

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 1. Section 1 of P. L. 1957, c. 67 (C. 58:16A-17) is amended to 2 read as follows:

3 1. Whenever, pursuant to the Federal Flood Control Act of 1938 as supplemented by the Act of August 18, 1941 as amended, the 4 State Treasurer has received or shall receive from the Federal 5 Government all or any part of the moneys received and deposited 6 in the Treasury of the United States on account of the leasing of 7 8 lands acquired by the United States for flood control, navigation and allied purposes, the State Treasurer shall forthwith pay over 9 said funds to the county or counties in which such property is 10 situate, in proportion to the receipts obtained from the leases of 11 the properties in the respective counties, to be expended by said 12county or counties for the benefit of any of the public schools and 13 public roads [of such county] either under the jurisdiction of the 14 county or of the municipality in which any of the aforesaid prop-15erties may lie, or for defraying the expenses of county government 16 in such county; provided, that when such property is situated in 17 more than one county, the distributive share to each county from 18 the proceeds of such property shall be proportional to its area 19 therein; and all of said moneys received by the State Treasurer 20as aforesaid are hereby appropriated to the several counties as 2122hereinbefore provided for the purposes set forth herein.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

EXPLANATION—Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

STATEMENT

This is an amendment to the law which provides for the distribution by the State Treasurer of moneys received from the Federal Government in connection with leases of lands acquired by the Federal Government under the Federal Flood Control Act of 1938 in the several counties of the State.

This amendment makes it clear that the moneys received and distributed to counties to be expended for public schools and roads of the county may also be expended for the public schools and roads of the municipalities wherein such lands acquired by the Federal Government are located.

The sponsor's statement adequately summarizes the objectives and provisions of the bill.

The Federal moneys referred to in C. 58:16A-17, which is amended by Senate Bill No. 1614, involve moneys obtained from the leasing of lands acquired by the Federal Government for purposes of flood control pursuant to 33 § 701a et seq. of the USCA.

The moneys to be received by an eligible municipality pursuant to Senate Bill No. 1614 shall only be used to finance the costs of the public schools or public roads of the municipality. FOR RELEASE TODAY

Governor Brendan Byrne signed two bills into law today while visiting the Warren County Farmers Fair in Harmony. Both bills were sponsored by Senator Wayne Dumont, Jr., (R-Passaic, Sussex and Warren).

<u>S-1524</u>--authorizes the use of facsimile signatures in the execution of bonds of Type II school districts. It also permits the use of facsimile signatures in authenticating coupons attached to such bonds.

The Governor pointed out that this new law "will be a great convenience to school board presidents, who usually have to take a day off for bond signings."

Municipalities and counties already use facsimile signatures for bond authorization purposes. Type I school districts use municipal bonds rather than school bonds to raise funds.

"Ample safeguards are provided," Covernor Byrne said, "as the facsimile signature of the board president must be attested by the actual signature of the board secretary or assistant secretary."

<u>S-1614</u>-permits certain Federal Flood Control Act monies which are received and distributed by counties to be used for public school and roads in certain municipalities.

This bill clarifies that funds distributed to counties under the Federal Flood Control Act may be used for public schools and roads in municipalities in which such lands are located.

During 1976, four New Jersey counties received a total of \$85,000 under this program and \$76,000 of this total went to Sussex County.
