PRE-FILED FOR INTRODUCTION IN THE 1976 SESSION

By Senators FELDMAN and HORN

AN ACT to amend the "Local Public Contracts Law," approved  
June 9, 1971 (P. L. 1971, c. 198).

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*  
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. Section 10 of P. L. 1971, c. 198 (C. 40A:11-10) is amended to  
2 read as follows:

3 10. Joint agreements for purchase of work, materials, supplies;  
4 authorization.

5 (a) The governing bodies of two or more contracting units within  
6 the same county, or adjoining counties, may provide by joint agree-  
7 ment for the purchase of work, materials and supplies for use by  
8 their respective jurisdictions.

9 (b) *The governing body of any county or municipality may pro-*  
10 *vide by joint agreement with the board of education of any school*  
11 *district located wholly or partially within the geographic bound-*  
12 *aries of the county or municipality for the purchase of work,*  
13 *materials and supplies for use by their respective jurisdictions.*

14 **[(a)]** (c) Such agreement shall be entered into by **[similar**  
15 **ordinances, in the case of municipalities, or resolutions, in the case**  
16 **of other contracting units,] resolution \*or ordinance, as the case**  
17 **may be,\*** adopted by each of the participating **[governing]** bodies  
18 **and boards;** which shall set forth the categories of work, materials  
19 and supplies to be purchased, the manner of advertising for bids  
20 and of awarding of contracts, the method of payment by each  
21 participating **[contracting unit] body and board,** and other matters  
22 deemed necessary to carry out the purposes of the agreement.

23 **[(b)]** (d) Each **[contracting unit's] participating body's and**  
24 **board's** share of expenditures for purchases under any such agree-

26 agreement and in the same manner as for other expenses of the  
27 **contracting unit** *participating body and board*.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

This bill has been drafted by the Division of Law Revision.

This bill will continue and clarify the right of counties and municipalities to enter into joint agreements with school districts located wholly or partially within the geographic boundaries of the county or municipality for the purchase of work, materials and supplies. Under the education statutes similar authority has been granted to boards of education.

Senate Bill No. 901 is a companion measure to Senate Bill No. 3090 (1975) which removes school districts from the provisions of the Local Public Contracts Law. The purpose of Senate Bill No. 901 is to allow any county or municipality to enter into joint purchasing agreements with the board of education of any school district located wholly or partially within the geographical boundaries of said county or municipality. The bill further allows municipalities to enter into such agreements by resolution rather than by ordinance.
